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25	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
26	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Arkansas public school
27	students and their parents or guardians should be confident that any person
28	who is allowed to volunteer at a school district or an education service
29	$\underline{\text{cooperative does not have a criminal record and is not a potential threat } \underline{\text{to}}$
30	the safety of children; and that this act is immediately necessary to afford
31	additional protection to school children from all persons in school districts
32	or education service cooperatives who might sexually, physically, or
33	emotionally abuse students entrusted into their care. Therefore, an
34	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for
35	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
36	effective on:

1	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
2	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
3	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
4	bill; or
5	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
6	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
