22	SECTION 1. Arkan	nsas Code § 7-5-106(a), concerr	ning runoff elections for
23	county and municipal officers, is amended to read as follows:		
24	(a)(l) If there are more than two (2) candidates for election to any		
25	county elected office,	including the office of justic	ce of the peace, at any
26	general election held :	in this state and no candidate	for the county elected
27	office receives a majority of the votes cast for the county elected office,		
28	there shall be a runoff general election held in that county three (3) weeks		
29	following the date of the general election at which the names of the two (2)		
30	candidates receiving the highest number of votes, but not a majority, shall		
31	be placed on the ballot to be voted upon by the qualified electors of the		
32	county.		
33		e following procedure will <u>shal</u>	
34	more than two (2) candidates for election to any <u>a</u> municipal office at any <u>a</u>		
35	general <u>or special</u> election held in this state in which no candidate for the		
36	municipal office receiv	ves either:	



1	(i) A majority of the votes cast; or	
2	(ii) A plurality of forty percent (40%) of the votes	
3	cast.	
4	(B)(i) A candidate who receives a plurality of forty	
5	percent (40%) of the votes cast must obtain at least twenty percent (20%)	
6	more of the votes cast than the second-place candidate for the municipal	
7	office to avoid a runoff general election against the second-place candidate.	
8	(ii) If required, the runoff general election	
9	between the two (2) candidates shall be held in that municipality three (3)	
10	weeks following the date of the general election with the names of the two	
11	(2) candidates placed on the ballot to be voted upon by the qualified	
12	electors of the municipality.
