10	(2) The privilege under subdivision (b)(1) of this section only		
11	applies when the communication was made to the certified peer support member		
12	during the course of an actual peer support event.		
13	(c) The privilege under subdivision (b)(1) of this section does not		
14	<pre>apply if:</pre>		
15	(1) The certified peer support member was an initial emergency		
16	service responder, a witness, or a party to the incident that prompted the		
17	providing of the peer support event to the emergency responder;		
18	(2) A communication reveals the intended commission of a crime		
19	or harmful act and the disclosure is determined to be necessary by the		
20	certified peer support member to protect any person from a clear, imminent		
21	risk of serious mental or physical harm or injury or to forestall a serious		
22	threat to the public safety; or		
23	(3) A crime has been committed and the crime is divulged to the		
24	certified peer support member.		
25	(d) A certified peer support member who knowingly reveals the contents		
26	of a communication privileged under this section or any person who knowingly		
27	threatens, intimidates, or forcibly compels, or attempts to threaten,		
28	intimidate, or forcibly compel a certified peer support member to disclose		
29	the contents of a privileged communication upon conviction is guilty of a		
30	Class B misdemeanor.
