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34	SECTION 2. Ark	kansas Code $ 6-85-212(e)(1) $ , concerning	the scholarship
35	award amount for a fu	ıll-time recipient at a four-year instit	ution of higher
36	education, is amended	d to read as follows:	

1	(e)(1)(A) Beginning with the $\frac{2011-2012}{2013-2014}$ academic year, the
2	Department of Higher Education shall distribute scholarship award amount
3	awards under this subchapter for an academic year for a full-time traditional
4	or nontraditional recipient enrolled in a four-year approved institution of
5	higher education is four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500) as provided
6	under § 6-85-222.
7	
8	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-85-212(e)(2)(A), concerning scholarship
9	award amounts, is amended to read as follows:
10	(2)(A) The department shall award an aggregate amount of
11	scholarship awards to nontraditional students beginning with the 2010-2011
12	academic year of twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000), plus any additional
13	amount authorized by law.
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15	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-85-212(e)(3) is repealed.
16	(3) The scholarship award for a full-time student enrolled in
17	one (1) of the following institutions of higher education is one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of
18	the scholarship award amount for a full-time undergraduate student enrolled
19	in a four-year approved institution of higher education:
20	(A) A two-year approved institution of higher education;
21	(B) A branch campus of a four-year approved institution of
22	higher education; or
23	(C) An approved nursing school.
24	
25	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 85, Subchapter 2, is amended
26	to add an additional section to read as follows:
27	6-85-222. Scholarship award distribution.
28	(a) The Department of Higher Education shall award scholarships under
29	this subchapter for an academic year but shall distribute the awards as
30	provided under this section after the last day to drop a class at an approved
31	institution of higher education in each fall and spring semester.
32	(b) For a recipient who has a minimum composite ACT score of twenty-
33	one (21) or higher or the equivalent score on an ACT equivalent and a high
34	school grade point average of 2.75 or higher if enrolled in the first
35	semester as a first-time freshman or a postsecondary grade point average of
36	2.75 or higher if enrolled in a subsequent semester, the annual scholarship

1	award amount is:
2	(1) Two thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$2,250) for a
3	recipient to attend a two-year approved institution of higher education,
4	distributed as:
5	(A) One thousand dollars (\$1,000) in the first semester
6	the recipient is enrolled; and
7	(B) One thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250) in the
8	second semester the recipient is enrolled; and
9	(2)(A) Three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for a
10	recipient to attend a four-year approved institution of higher education,
11	distributed as one thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$1,750) each
12	semester.
13	(B) A recipient under subdivision (b)(1) of this section
14	who attends two (2) years at a two-year approved institution of higher
15	education and maintains or exceeds a minimum postsecondary grade point
16	average of 2.75 may transfer to a four-year approved institution of higher
17	education and receive the scholarship award amount under subdivision
18	(b)(2)(A) of this section.
19	(c) For a recipient who has a minimum composite ACT score of nineteen
20	(19) or twenty (20) or the equivalent score on an ACT equivalent and a high
21	school grade point average of 2.50 or higher if enrolled in the first
22	semester as a first-time freshman or a postsecondary grade point average of
23	2.50 if enrolled in a subsequent semester, the annual scholarship award
24	amount is:
25	(1) Two thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$2,250) for a
26	recipient to attend a two-year approved institution of higher education in
27	the recipient's first year of enrollment, distributed as:
28	(A) Eight hundred dollars (\$800) in the first semester of
29	each year; and
30	(B) One thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$1,450) in
31	the second semester of each year;
32	(2) One thousand dollars (\$1,000) for a recipient to attend a
33	four-year approved institution of higher education in the recipient's first
34	year of enrollment, distributed as five hundred dollars (\$500) in each
35	semester;
36	(3) One thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) for a recipient

Т	to attend a four-year approved institution of higher education in the
2	recipient's second year of enrollment, distributed as seven hundred fifty
3	dollars (\$750) each semester;
4	(4) Three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for a recipient
5	to attend a four-year approved institution of higher education in the
6	recipient's third year of enrollment, distributed as:
7	(A) One thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) in the
8	first semester; and
9	(B) Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in the second semester;
10	<u>and</u>
11	(5) Four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500) for a recipient
12	to attend a four-year approved institution of higher education in the
13	recipient's fourth year of enrollment, distributed as:
14	(A) Two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in the first semester;
15	<u>and</u>
16	(B) Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) in the
17	second semester.
18	(d) First and second semesters shall be consecutive except that the
19	following semesters are not counted:
20	(1) A summer semester; or
21	(2) A semester for which the department has granted a waiver of
22	continuing eligibility and the student is not enrolled.
23	(e)(1) The department shall not distribute funds in the second
24	semester of an academic year if the recipient has not maintained continuing
25	eligibility for the scholarship for the second semester.
26	(2) Scholarship award amounts that are not paid in the second
27	semester of an academic year due to a recipient's failure to maintain
28	continuing eligibility shall be added to the aggregate amount of scholarship
29	awards for nontraditional students under § 6-85-212(e)(2).
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31	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
32	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that increasing the number of
33	Arkansans obtaining postsecondary credentials is critical to the economic
34	health of the state and its citizens; that the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery
35	provides the opportunity for tens of thousands of Arkansans to obtain
36	postsecondary education: that the deadline for scholarship applications is

T	June 1, 2013; that the linancial integrity of the Arkansas Scholarship
2	Lottery is critical to the continued existence of the scholarships; and that
3	this act is immediately necessary because the Department of Higher Education
4	must promulgate rules to implement this act before June 1, 2013, in order to
5	provide eligible Arkansans the opportunity to apply for the scholarship.
6	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
7	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
8	become effective on:
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
12	bill; or
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
