5	fund to be known as the "Open Enrollment Public Charter School Capital Grant			
6	Program Fund".			
7	(b) The fund shall consist of those general revenues as may be			
8	authorized by law and other nonfederal funds as may be provided by law.			
9	(c) The fund shall be used for distributing grants for programs			
10	providing assistance to open enrollment public charter schools concerning			
11	academic facilities and equipment and the repayment of debt incurred relating			
12	to academic facilities and equipment under the Open Enrollment Public Charter

16	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. For the school year			
17	2013-2014, an open enrollment public charter school is eligible to apply for			
18	and receive a grant under this act only if the open enrollment public charter			
19	<u>school:</u>			
20	(1) Has been in existence for five (5) or more years before			
21	applying for the grant;			
22	(2) Has a student population of which sixty percent (60%) or			
23	more are students who are national school lunch students;			
24	(3) Provides transportation for its students to and from school;

26	(4) Has a record of academic success as defined by the			
27	<u>Department of Education.</u>			
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
