6	(b)(1)(C)(i) of this section, the system shall return any member			
7	contributions for the affected fiscal year without interest.

9	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
10	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that provisions of the Arkansas			
11	Teacher Retirement System Act are in need of revision to bring them into			
12	conformance with sound public pension policy; that members may not be able t			
13	retire as they have planned and anticipated because of outstanding			
14	underpayments to the system; that current law does not allow for another			
15	mechanism to make underpayments to the system; that the provisions of this			
16	act allows a member to settle past obligations to the system and retire as			
17	they anticipated; and that this act is immediately necessary to have an			
18	impact on members who are planning on retiring at the end of the school year			
19	and who are otherwise eligible to retire. Therefore, an emergency is			
20	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the			
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective			
22	on:			
23	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
24	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
25	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
26	bill; or			
27	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
28	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
