1 without forfeiting his rights to retirement benefits under this section. 2 (2)(A) Any judge or justice who is not eligible to retire at age 3 seventy (70) may continue to serve as judge until the completion of the term 4 of office in which he receives sufficient credited service to retire without 5 losing his retirement benefits. 6 (B) The judge or justice shall lose all retirement 7 benefits if he serves beyond the end of the term needed to get sufficient 8 credited service to retire. 9 (3)(A) Otherwise, judges or justices must retire by their 10 seventieth birthday or lose their retirement benefits. 11 (B) However, any active judge or justice who was serving 12 prior to July 1, 1965, may continue to serve until any age and shall, upon retirement, be eligible to receive retirement benefits. 13 14 15 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 24-8-218(c)(4)(A), concerning retirement and survivors' benefits generally, is amended to read as follows: 16 17 (4)(A) Any A judge or justice under the age of seventy (70) who 18 is receiving retirement benefits under this subchapter or § 24-8-701 et seq. 19 and who is elected or appointed to any judicial office in this state and who foregoes receipt of retirement benefits while serving in the judicial office 20 21 shall be entitled to resume receiving his or her previous retirement benefits 22 upon termination of the subsequent service. 23 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 24-8-224 is repealed. 24 25 24-8-224. Benefits when serving past mandatory retirement age. 26 (a) Notwithstanding § 24 8-215 regarding mandatory retirement under 27 the Arkansas Judicial Retirement System for any judge or justice upon 28 reaching seventy (70) years of age or any other law to the contrary, any 29 judge or justice covered under the system who served continuously for at 30 least sixteen (16) years, who is at least eighty (80) years of age, who is not serving on April 19, 1995, and who is ineligible for retirement due to 31 32 having served beyond the mandatory retirement age shall be entitled to 33 receive retirement benefits under the system. (b) Retirement benefits under this section shall be retroactive to 34 35 January 1, 1995, or, for judges or justices retiring after 1995, to January 1

of the year of retirement.

2	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 24-8-710(b), concerning eligibility for		
3	benefits and retirement generally, is repealed.		
4	(b)(1) Any judge or justice who becomes seventy (70) years of age		
5	during a term of office to which he or she has been elected may complete the		
6	term without forfeiting his or her rights to retirement benefits under this		
7	section.		
8	(2)(A) Any judge or justice who is not eligible to retire at ago		
9	seventy (70) may continue to serve as judge or justice until the completion		
10	of the term of office in which he or she has sufficient service to retire		
11	without losing his or her retirement benefits.		
12	(B) The judge or justice shall lose all retirement		
13	benefits if he or she serves beyond the end of the term needed to get		
14	sufficient service to retire.		
15	(3)(A) Otherwise, judges or justices must retire by their		
16	seventieth birthday or lose their retirement benefits.		
17	(B) However, any active judge or justice who was serving		
18	prior to July 1, 1965, may continue to serve until any age and upon		
19	retirement shall be eligible to receive retirement benefits.
