20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

7 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for
 8 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2013-2014 fiscal
 9 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be
 10 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such
 11 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,
 12 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
 13 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
 14 appropriate classification.

15

16 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
 18 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the
 19 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-
 20 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from
 21 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a
 22 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not
 23 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.
 24 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as
 25 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)
 26 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget
 27 request.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
 29 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

30

31 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
 33 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas
 34 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary
 35 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds
 36 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a

1 UAMS Temporary Pool: Five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay
 2 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this
 3 Act.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
 5 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

 7 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,
 8 to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, to be payable from the

35 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHAPLAIN

1 HOUSING ALLOWANCE. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical
2 Sciences may designate up to forty-five percent (45%) of the regular gross
3 salary (or stipend) of a minister or other clergy employed as a Chaplain or
4 appointed as a Chaplain Resident, as a housing allowance, to the extent used
5 by the person to rent or provide a home, according to the guidelines of the
6 Internal Revenue Service Code, Section 107 and the Arkansas Code 26-51-
7 404(b)(9).

8 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
9 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

10
11 SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INDIGENT
13 CARE REIMBURSEMENT. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is
14 hereby authorized to utilize funds appropriated by this Act to extend
15 provisions of Act 688 of 1989 to authorize procedures for the disbursement of
16 Indigent Care maintenance and general operations appropriations to be paid
17 from cash funds of the institution, subject to reimbursement and correction
18 of reporting, as provided by Arkansas Code 19-4-1609.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
20 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

21
22 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
24 ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". (a) The Arkansas Department of Higher
25 Education shall establish and maintain for the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal
26 year a pool of three hundred (300) nonclassified positions at a salary level
27 not to exceed \$293,550. These positions are to be used by the University of
28 Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal services needs
29 of the University during the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal year exceed the
30 number of positions allocated to the University by the Legislature. The
31 University shall provide justification to the Arkansas Department of Higher
32 Education for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
33 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
34 positions are requested by the University, approved by the University Board
35 or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council. Furthermore, the
36 Office of Personnel Management (OPM) of the Division of Management Services

1 of the Department of Finance and Administration shall establish and maintain
2 for the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal year a pool of three hundred (300) career
3 service positions up to a C130. These positions are to be used by the
4 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal
5 services needs of the University during the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal year
6 exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to the
7 University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to
8 OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No
9 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
10 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved
11 by the Legislative Council.

12 (b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency
13 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
14 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and
15 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly
16 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
17 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
18 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in
19 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the
20 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary
21 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the
22 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
23 Council in the utilization of the growth pool. Therefore, the requirement of
24 approval by the Legislative Council is not a severable part of this section.
25 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council is ruled
26 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
27 void.

28 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
29 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
30 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
32 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

33

34 SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CHILD AND
36 FAMILY LIFE INSTITUTE. The Child Health and Family Life Institute shall be

1 administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas
2 Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative agreement and/or contract
3 with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics
4 for services required to deliver the programs of the Child Health and Family
5 Life Institute (CHFLI). Utilizing a multidisciplinary collaboration of
6 professionals, CHFLI shall provide a statewide effort to explore, develop and
7 evaluate new and better ways to address medically, socially and economically
8 interrelated health and developmental needs of children with special health
9 care needs and their families. CHFLI priorities shall include, but are not
10 limited to, wellness and prevention, screening and diagnosis, treatment and
11 intervention, training and education and research and evaluation. Arkansas
12 Children's Hospital and the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-
13 Department of Pediatrics shall make annual reports to the Arkansas
14 Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing programs and services
15 offered through CHFLI.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
17 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

19 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARKING
21 FEES. On July 1 of each year the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
22 shall pay from the appropriation provided herein from non-general revenue,
23 the total amount appropriated for War Memorial Stadium Commission Parking
24 Services from Fees to the War Memorial Stadium Commission.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
26 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

27

28 SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
30 PROVISIONS. Because the Rural Medical Practice Student Loan and Scholarship
31 Program Loans and/or Scholarships and the Community Match Student Loan and
32 Scholarship Program Loans and/or Scholarships have the goal of providing
33 primary care physicians in rural Arkansas, transfers may be made in such
34 amounts as are required between the line items made in the appropriation for
35 "Medical Loans and Scholarships".

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~

1 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

3 SECTION 41. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CLINICAL
5 EXPANSION AND RESEARCH POOL. (a) In order to address personnel needs emerging
6 from expanding medical research and patient care issues and the necessity of
7 recruiting and retaining qualified medical, research, and related support
8 personnel, the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences or its successor
9 is authorized for the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal year a pool of seven hundred
10 (700) "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions. These positions are
11 to be used by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event
12 that the personal services needs resulting from unanticipated clinical or
13 research programs that are initiated during the ~~2012-2013~~ 2013-2014 fiscal
14 year require additional positions, either in title, in classification, or in
15 number, that are not authorized or contemplated by the General Assembly in
16 Section 1 of this Act.

17 (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to
18 access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in
19 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the
20 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the
21 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional
22 positions exists. Only Medical or research positions shall be established
23 under this provision. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for
24 Medical Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification
25 of allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool"
26 to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher
27 Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
28 for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles
29 and salaries of personnel who have been employed in positions established
30 from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated with the
31 positions.

32 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
33 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
34 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
35 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.

36 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency

1 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
2 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the
3 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has
4 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
5 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
17 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

18
19 SECTION 42. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL
21 COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized
22 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires
23 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff
24 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day
25 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform
26 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the
27 appropriate compensation.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
29 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

30
31 SECTION 43. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
33 PSYCHIATRIC RESEARCH INSTITUTE & DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS REPORTS. The
34 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall report quarterly each
35 fiscal year to the Legislative Council on program activities and the
36 expenditure of funds from the Psychiatric Research Institute and Department

1 of Pediatrics appropriation for Building Effective Services for Trauma
2 programs for children and adolescents.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2012~~
4 2013 through June 30, ~~2013~~ 2014.

5
6 SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
8 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
9 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
10 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
11 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
12 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
13 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as
14 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
15 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
16 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
17 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
18 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
19 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
20 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
21 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,
22 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
23 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
24 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
25 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
26 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
27 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
28 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
29 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
30 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
31 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
32 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
33 Pediatrics.

34
35 SECTION 45. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
36 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency

1 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
2 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
5 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
6 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
7 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
8 with in disbursement of said funds.

9
10 SECTION 46. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
11 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
12 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
13 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
14 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
15 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
16 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
17 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

18
19 SECTION 47. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
20 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
21 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
22 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of
23 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
24 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
25 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm
26 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
27 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
28 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
29 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013.
