18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
19 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of
20 Information Systems is a cost recovery agency subject to the requirements of
21 the United States Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost
22 Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost
23 Principles for Developing Cost Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for
24 Agreements with the Federal Government Implementation Guide for the Office of
25 Management and Budget Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal
26 rules, it is necessary to establish an Innovation and Project Development
27 appropriation and general revenue fund account within the Department of
28 Finance and Administration Disbursing Officer for the Department of
29 Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise innovation
30 projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State that
31 cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of Information
32 Systems will maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes.
33 Fund transfers may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the
34 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the
35 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the
36 Department of Information Systems for the amounts billed.

2 SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK
4 FORCE 2000 DISTRIBUTION. After the amounts to be made available to the
5 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have
6 been determined as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents
7 as may be necessary shall be processed so that funds may be transferred from
8 the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund
9 account from which the technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning
10 center draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be transferred
11 shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds available from the Work Force 2000
12 Development Fund during each fiscal year.

13 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational
14 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund
15 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and
16 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
17 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
18 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
19 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
20 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2013~~
22 2014 through June 30, ~~2014~~ 2015.

23
24 SECTION 80. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
26 PROCEDURES – EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not sufficient
27 appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of Extra Help
28 for any state agency for the period ending June 30, ~~2014~~ 2015, said agency
29 may request a transfer from appropriations provided for Extra Help in Section
30 2, Miscellaneous Transfers, herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
31 State, stating clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief
32 Fiscal Officer of the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas
33 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be
34 notified as to the amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to
35 be made. The appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the
36 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided

1 further, that if desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those
2 regularly appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the
3 agency.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2013~~
5 2014 through June 30, ~~2014~~ 2015.

6
7 *SECTION 81. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT - EMPLOYEE SALARIES.*

8 *Arkansas Code § 21-5-211(b), concerning adjustments to state employee*
9 *salaries, is amended to read as follows:*

10 *(b)(1)(A) The maximum annual rate of compensation for which an*
11 *employee is eligible on ~~July 1, 2013,~~ July 1, 2014, shall be determined by*
12 *increasing the employee's ~~June 30, 2013,~~ June 30, 2014, salary by ~~two percent~~*
13 *~~(2%)~~ one percent (1%).*

14 *(B) The line item maximum annual salary rates established by the*
15 *Eighty-Ninth General Assembly for nonclassified positions may be increased by*
16 *one percent (1%), and the resulting salary shall represent the maximum annual*
17 *salary rate for the 2015 fiscal year.*

18 *(2) The ~~additional~~ salary increase of ~~two percent (2%) on July 1,~~*
19 *~~2013,~~ authorized by subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section shall not allow an*
20 *employee's compensation to exceed the maximum pay level amount set out for*
21 *the position unless the employee is eligible for the career pay level as*
22 *established in § 21-5-214.*

23 *(3) If an employee does not meet the service requirements in § 21-*
24 *5-214, the increase shall be paid as a lump sum on the last pay period of the*
25 *fiscal year of the year in which the increase is to occur.*

26 *(4)(A) An employee compensated at the highest pay level rate*
27 *authorized for the grade assigned to his or her classification may receive*
28 *the ~~July 1, 2013,~~ July 1, 2014, salary increase of ~~two percent (2%)~~ one*
29 *percent (1%) authorized in this section as a lump-sum payment.*

30 *(B) However, the salary increase shall be paid as a lump sum on*
31 *the last pay period of the ~~fiscal year of the~~ 2015 fiscal year ~~in which the~~*
32 *~~increase is to occur,~~ and the payment shall not be construed as exceeding the*
33 *maximum salary of the employee.*

34
35 *SECTION 82. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds*
36 *authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency*

1 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
2 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
3 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
4 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
5 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
6 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
7 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

8
9 SECTION 83. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

17
18 SECTION 84. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
19 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
20 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of
22 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
23 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
24 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm
25 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
26 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
27 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
28 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
