14	AS COPD AWARENESS MONTH IN ARKANSAS.
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17	WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a term used to
18	describe airflow obstruction that is associated mainly with emphysema and
19	chronic bronchitis; and
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21	WHEREAS, COPD affects over 24 million individuals in the United States
22	and kills more than 124,000 Americans every year, and on average 1 person
23	dies from COPD every 5 minutes; and
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25	WHEREAS, COPD is a chronic and progressive disease that affects an
26	estimated 24 million persons nationwide, half of whom have not been properly
27	diagnosed, and 70% of whom are under age; and
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29	WHEREAS, COPD currently accounts for 1.5 million emergency room visits,
30	726,000 hospitalizations, and 8 million physician office visits and hospital
31	outpatient visits, all of which are detrimental to the United States economy;

33 34	WHEREAS, COPD costs the nation an estimated \$49.9 billion in direct and
35	indirect health care costs annually; and
36	indiffeet hearth care costs annually, and

1	WHEREAS, COPD affects an estimated 7.5% of the state's citizens and is
2	the third-leading cause of death in this state; and
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4	WHEREAS, research has identified a hereditary protein deficiency called
5	Alpha-l Antitrypsin, and individuals with this deficiency tend to develop
6	COPD despite the lack of exposure to smoking and other environmental
7	triggers; and
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9	WHEREAS, recently the death rate for women with COPD has surpassed the
10	death rate of men with COPD, and women over 40 years of age are the fastest
11	growing segment of the population developing this irreversible disease due
12	mostly to the equalization of opportunity over the past several generations
13	for men and women to smoke; and
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15	WHEREAS, there is currently no cure for COPD although spirometry
16	testing and medical treatments exist to address symptom relief and possibly
17	slow progression of the disease; and
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19	WHEREAS, until there is a cure, the best approaches to preventing COPD
20	and its considerable health, societal, and mortality impacts lie in
21	education, awareness, and expanded delivery of detection and management
22	protocols,
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24	NOW THEREFORE,
25	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
26	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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28	THAT the Senate designates the month of November 2014 as COPD Awareness
29	Month in Arkansas to promote greater public awareness, enhance education,
30	erase the stigma, and increase early diagnosis of this disease in order to
31	save lives and to reduce health costs in Arkansas.
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
