19	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined to the second section of the second s	nined by	<u>the</u>	
20	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that funds provide	ed by th	<u>ne General</u>	
21	Assembly for the operations of the Department of Correction have, due to			
22	unforeseen circumstances, become insufficient for the department to provide			
23	essential governmental services; that this act provides add	<u>itional</u>	funds that	
24	are necessary for the department to provide essential govern			
25	and that a delay in this act's effective date would work ir	reparabl	<u>le harm</u>	
26	upon the proper administration of the department and the per	rformano	ce of its	
27	duties. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being			
28	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and			
29	safety shall become effective on:			
30	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
31	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed			
32	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
33	bill; or			
34	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and	the veto	<u>is</u>	
35	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.			

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
