18	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determ	ined by	<u>the</u>	
19	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that funds provided by the General			
20	Assembly for the operations of the Department of Correction have, due to			
21	unforeseen circumstances, become insufficient for the depart	ment to	o provide	
22	essential governmental services; that this act provides additional funds that			
23	are necessary for the department to provide essential govern	mental	services;	
24	and that a delay in this act's effective date would work irreparable harm			
25	upon the proper administration of the department and the performance of its			
26	duties. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being			
27	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and			
28	safety shall become effective on:			
29	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
30	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
31	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
32	bill; or			
33	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
34	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
