- 22 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
- 23 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Health Care Independence
- 24 Program, as implemented, is not consistent with the intent of the General
- 25 Assembly and does not best serve the citizens of Arkansas; that the citizens
- 26 of Arkansas and private insurance companies need immediate direction about
- 27 the law creating the Health Care Independence Program before investing time,
- 28 funds, personnel, and other resources in the Health Care Independence Program
- 29 policies; and that this act is necessary because now is the optimal time to
- 30 end the Health Care Independence Program before further funds are expended.
- 31 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
- 32 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
- 33 become effective on:
- 34 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
- 35 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
- 36 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
