Arkansas Code § 17-20-104(b), concerning criminal 15 penalties, is amended to read as follows: 16 (b) Any person, firm, or corporation which shall operate as a barber, 17 barbershop, barber corporation, or barber school or college without a 18 certificate of registration duly and legally issued by the State Board of 19 Barber Examiners Department of Health shall be deemed guilty of a 20 misdemeanor, punishable upon conviction by a fine of not less than twenty-21 five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100). 22 23 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-20-201 is amended to read as follows: 24 17-20-201. Creation — Members. 25 (a)(1) There is created a State Board of Barber Examiners, Barber 26 Technical Advisory Committee consisting of the Secretary of the State Board 27 of Health, who shall be an ex officio member of the board, and five (5) four 28 (4) members to be appointed by the Governor State Board of Health for a term of six (6) years. 29 30 (2) Three (3) Two (2) of the members so appointed shall be 31 practicing barbers who have followed the occupation of barbering in this 32 state for at least five (5) years immediately prior to their appointment. 33 (3) One (1) member appointed by the Governor will be a public member to represent the consumer, and one (1) member appointed by the 34 35 Governor board to represent persons sixty-five (65) years of age and beyond. 36 The two (2) members appointed under this subdivision (a)(3) shall not be

- (a) No action in refusing to issue or renew or in suspending or revoking a certificate of registration for any of the causes listed in § 17-20-308 shall be taken until the accused has been furnished with a statement of the specific charges against him or her and notice of the time and place of hearing thereof.
- 13 (b) The statement of charges and notice must be served personally upon 14 the person or mailed to his or her last known address at least twenty (20) 15 days prior to the hearing.
- 16 (c) The accused may be present at the hearing in person or by counsel, 17 or both.

- 32 (a) Every applicant for a certificate of registration to operate a new

- 35 in a particular area will not be detrimental to the public welfare.
- 36 (b) In considering whether the establishment of a new barber college in

- 1 a particular area will be detrimental to the public welfare, the board
- 2 <u>department</u> shall consider the need for barber college facilities or
- 3 additional barber college facilities, as the case may be, in the community
- 4 where the proposed barber college is to be located, giving particular
- 5 consideration to:
- 6 (1) The economic character of the community;
- 7 (2) The adequacy of existing barbershops and barber colleges in 8 that community;
- 9 (3) The ability of the community to support the proposed barber 10 college;
- 11 (4) The character of adjacent communities and the extent to which 12 the establishment of the proposed barber college would draw patrons from such 13 adjacent communities; and
- 14 (5) The social and economic effect of the establishment of a 15 barber college on the community where it is proposed to be located and on the 16 adjacent communities.

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- SECTION 21. Arkansas Code § 17-20-405 is amended to read as follows: 19 17-20-405. Licensing prerequisites — Managers and teachers.
 - (a) No school or college of barbering shall be approved by the State

 Board of Barber Examiners Department of Health and no license shall be issued to operate or conduct any school or college of barbering until the following provisions are complied with:
- 24 (1) The management and faculty are registered barber teachers 25 under this subchapter;
 - (2) The teacher must be a high school graduate;
- 27 (3) The teacher shall have completed a postgraduate course of six 28 hundred (600) hours in barber teacher theory in an approved school, which 29 school shall regularly offer such a course;
- 30 (4) At least one (1) approved teacher is teaching therein at all 31 times and in charge of each daily class in theoretical scientific study, 32 scientific barbering practice, and general barbering practice at all times;
- 33 (5) One (1) teacher is provided for every twenty (20) students; 34 and
- 35 (6)(A) Every teacher shall pay a teacher license fee of forty 36 dollars (\$40.00) per year.

- 1 (B) For restoration of an expired license to practice as a 2 teacher, the teacher shall pay a fee of forty-eight dollars (\$48.00).
 - (b) Section 17-20-404(4)-(6) shall not apply to any school or college of barbering which was engaged in the operation or conduct of any such school or college on June 16, 1961.
 - (c) Any person who has been continuously licensed or registered in another state to practice barbering who also meets the requirements of subdivisions (a)(2) and (3) of this section may be issued a certificate of registration as a registered barber teacher upon making application as required by law and upon payment of a one hundred fifty dollar reciprocity fee to obtain registration in this state as a registered barber, plus a one hundred fifty dollar barber teacher reciprocity fee.
 - (d) The board department may license a secondary educational institution as a school or college of barbering.
 - (e) The board department shall indicate in writing on the license of a school or college of barbering whether the school is licensed as a secondary or postsecondary institution.

SECTION 22. Arkansas Code § 17-20-406 is amended to read as follows: 17-20-406. Manager certification.

Application for examination for a manager certificate shall be filed with the State Board of Barber Examiners Department of Health on blank forms prepared and furnished by the board department and shall be accompanied by the fee prescribed in § 17-20-409.

SECTION 23. Arkansas Code § 17-20-407 is amended to read as follows: 17-20-407. Curriculum.

- (a) No school or college of barbering shall be approved by the State

 Board of Barber Examiners Department of Health and no license shall be issued to operate or conduct any school or college of barbering until the applicant demonstrates to the board department that it is fully qualified to thoroughly educate and instruct students in all subjects necessary and required to qualify them as competent barbers.
- (b) No school of barbering shall be approved by the board <u>department</u> unless it:
 - (1) Requires as a prerequisite to admission thereto graduation

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     from an eighth grade school or possession of an equivalent education to be
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     determined by an examination conducted by the board department;
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                 (2)(A) Requires as a prerequisite to graduation a course of
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     instruction and practice of not fewer than five hundred fifty (550) hours for
