20	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 3-4-201(c)(3)(B)(ii), concerning the

8	on inactive status for more than eighteen (18) months after the provisions of
9	subdivision (c)(4) of this section become <u>became</u> effective or which <u>that</u> has
10	expired in accordance with <u>under</u> subdivision (c)(4) of this section, do not
11	divest any permit holder holding the permit on July 1, 1991 <u>August 1, 2015</u> ,
12	regardless of the quota ratio, of his or her permit.

23	with the board after July 1, 1991.

25	SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 3-5-102 is amended to read as follows:
26	3-5-102. Additional license to sell native <u>beer and small farm</u> wines
27	not required.
28	Any <u>A licensed</u> retail liquor dealer who has been duly licensed as such
29	shall have the right <u>may</u> without any additional license fee to sell native
30	wines manufactured from fruits, vegetables, and other products grown in the
31	State of Arkansa s <u>beer and small farm wines</u> .
