6	SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
8	PRIORITIES. A high priority of the College of The Ouachitas shall be to
9	combat illiteracy and to provide industrial training in the work place.
10	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, -2014
11	<u>2015</u> through June 30,— <u>2015</u> <u>2016</u> .
12	
13	SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
14	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HENDERSON
15	STATE UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE OF THE OUACHITAS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT.
16	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
17	(1) Henderson State University and College of The Ouachitas are
18	two institutions of Higher Education with a long history of cooperation and
19	mutual support for the pursuit of their missions to serve the residents of
20	their overlapping service areas;
21	(2) These institutions have entered into an agreement to
22	continue the goodwill that has been established between them and throughout
23	the communities they serve, and to enhance the level of services to the
24	residents of Clark County without duplicating efforts; and
25	(3) Working strategically, the institutions can meet the needs
26	of the residents of Clark County in a manner that fosters partnership and
27	collaboration.
28	(b) Based upon the agreement of the parties:
29	(1) College of The Ouachitas shall:
30	(A) Limit any offerings in Clark County to non-academic,
31	technical courses and programs that are not offered at Henderson State
32	University;
33	(B) Not offer any academic courses or programs, including
34	remediation, in Clark County;
35	(C)(i) Notify, meet, and discuss with Henderson State
36	University prior to offering any new credit-bearing technical programs in

1	Clark County.		
2	(ii) To minimize confusion, any such offering will be		
3	delivered in conjunction with the Community Education Center; and		
4	(D) Only establish a physical presence in Clark County in		
5	partnership with Henderson State University's Community Education Center; and		
6	(2)(A) Henderson State University shall offer to College of The		
7	Ouachitas the first right of refusal for the instruction of technical		
8	training courses and programs requested by business and industry that cannot		
9	be provided directly by Henderson State University.		
10	(B) The courses and programs shall be provided at the		
11	Community Education Center or within Clark County.		
12	(c) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July		
13	1,-2014 2015, through June 30,-2015 2016.		
14			
15	SECTION 7. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds		
16	authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency		
17	and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and		
18	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and		
19	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary		
20	Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures		
21	Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this		
22	State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of		
23	Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied		
24	with in disbursement of said funds.		
25			
26	SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General		
27	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations		
28	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for		
29	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive		
30	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget		
31	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or		
32	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative		
33	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.		
34			

SECTION 9. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

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     appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
 2
     effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
     the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 3
     the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
 4
 5
     effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
 6
     upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
 7
    programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
8
     being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
9
     and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
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
