## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF MULTIDRAW SCREEN-BASED  
10 LOTTERY GAMES FOR THE ARKANSAS SCHOLARSHIP LOTTERY;  
11 TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.  
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## Subtitle

15 TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF MULTIDRAW SCREEN-  
16 BASED LOTTERY GAMES FOR THE ARKANSAS  
17 SCHOLARSHIP LOTTERY; AND TO DECLARE AN  
18 EMERGENCY.  
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 23-115-411 is amended to read as follows:  
24 23-115-411. Multidraw screen-based lottery game prohibited.

25 ~~(a)-(1)~~ (a) A multidraw screen-based lottery game shall not be used as  
26 part of a lottery under this chapter except as provided under ~~subdivision~~  
27 ~~(a)-(2)~~ subsection (b) of this section.

28 ~~(2)~~ (b) All lottery games operated by the Arkansas Lottery  
29 Commission on or before June 29, 2014, are permitted and may continue as a  
30 part of the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery.

31 ~~(b) The prohibition of multidraw screen-based lottery games shall~~  
32 ~~expire on March 13, 2015.~~  
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34 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
35 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that multidraw screen-based lottery  
36 games were never intended to be used by a lottery implemented by the General



1 Assembly; that implementing multidraw screen-based lottery games would expand  
2 the constitutional amendment beyond its intended purpose; and that this act  
3 is immediately necessary to ensure the integrity of the lottery as envisioned  
4 by Arkansas citizens. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this  
5 act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,  
6 health, and safety shall become effective on:

7 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

8 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
9 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
10 bill; or

11 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
12 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
