shall provide voter registration opportunities to those obtaining or renewing drivers licenses, personal identification cards, duplicate or corrected licenses or cards, or changing address or name whether in person or by mail. The Office of Driver Services and State Revenue Offices shall use a computer process, which combines the drivers license and voter registration applications, minimizing duplicative information, and shall have available the federal or state mail voter registration application form, which may be used upon request or when the computer process is not available. If a person declines to apply to register to vote, the Office of Driver Services or State Revenue Office shall retain the record of declination for two (2) years.

(3) All public assistance agencies shall provide a federal or state mail voter registration application form with each application for assistance, and with each recertification, renewal or change of address or name relating to such assistance. Public assistance agencies shall provide voter registration application forms as part of the intake process, or as a combined computer process when a computer process is available. Public assistance agencies shall use a process or form that combines the application for assistance with the voter registration application when available. Public assistance agencies shall also provide declination forms as described in 51-6 [section 6] of this amendment, which shall be retained for two (2) years if an applicant declines to apply to register to vote.

(4)(3) All disabilities agencies shall provide a federal or

state mail voter registration application form with each application for services and with each recertification, renewal or change of address or name relating to such services. Disabilities agencies shall provide voter registration application forms as part of the intake process, or as a combined computer process when a computer process is available. Disabilities agencies may use a form that combines the application for services or assistance with the voter registration application when available. If the disabilities agency provides services in a person's home, then the agency shall also provide voter registration services at the person's home. Disabilities agencies shall also provide declination forms as described in 51-6 [section 6] of this amendment, which shall be retained for two (2) years if an applicant declines to apply to register to vote.

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2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 51, § 5 is amended to add		
3	an additional subsection to read as follows:		
4	(f)(1) The Office of Driver Services with the advice, assistance, and		
5	approval of the Secretary of State shall establish a schedule and method for		
6	the Office of Driver Services to electronically provide to the Secretary of		
7	State the records specified in this section.		
8	(2)(A) The Office of Driver Services shall provide to the		
9	Secretary of State, in the manner and method agreed upon by the Office of		
10	Driver Services and the Secretary of State, the following information		
11	associated with each person who obtains or renews a drivers license, personal		
12	identification card, or duplicate or corrected license or card or changes his		
13	or her address or name whether in person or by mail:		
14	(i) Name;		
15	(ii) Date of Birth;		
16	(iii) Either or both of the following, as contained		
17	in the Office of Driver Service's records:		
18	(a) Residence address; or		
19	(b) Mailing address;		
20	(iv) Telephone number;		
21	(v) Email address, if available;		
22	(vi) Political party preference;		
23	(vii) Whether or not the person affirmatively		
24	declined to become registered to vote during a transaction with the Office of		
25	Driver Services;		
26	(viii) A notation that the person has attested that		
27	he or she is eligible to register to vote; and		
28	(ix) Any other information required to be submitted

30	(B)(i) Records provided to the Secretary of State under

1	(3) The Secretary of State shall not sell, transfer, or allow
2	any third party access to the information acquired from the Office of Driver
3	Services pursuant to this subsection without approval of the Office of Driver
4	Services, except as specifically permitted by law.
5	(4)(A) The records of a person collected and transmitted under
6	this subsection shall constitute a completed affidavit of registration.
7	(B) The Secretary of State shall immediately submit the
8	records collected and transmitted under this subsection to the appropriate
9	county clerk.
10	(C) The appropriate county clerk shall register the person
11	to vote unless any of the following conditions are satisfied:
12	(i) The person's records under this subsection
13	reflect that he or she affirmatively declined to become registered to vote
14	during a transaction with the Office of Driver Services;
15	(ii) The person's records under this subsection do
16	not reflect that he or she has attested to meeting all voter eligibility
17	requirements; or
18	(iii) The county clerk determines that the person is
19	ineligible to vote.
20	(D) If a person who is registered to vote under this
21	subsection does not provide a party preference, his or her party preference
22	shall be designated as "Unknown", and he or she shall be treated as having no
23	party preference.
24	(5) A person registered to vote under this subsection may cancel
25	his or her voter registration at any time by any method available to any
26	other registered voter.
27	(6) The Office of Driver Services and the Secretary of State
28	shall adopt rules in furtherance of this section including without limitation
29	the following:
30	(A) A process for canceling the registration of a person
31	who is ineligible to vote, but becomes registered under this subsection;
32	(B) The method for electronically transmitting the records
33	under this subsection; and
34	(C) An education and outreach campaign to be conducted by
35	the Secretary of State informing voters about voter registration under this
36	subsection.
