The subsection of Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 1, 8 titled "Initiative" is amended to read as follows: Initiative. The first power reserved by the people is the initiative. 9 10 Eight per cent percent (8%) of the legal voters may propose any law and ten 11 per cent percent (10%) may propose a constitutional amendment by initiative 12 petition and every such petition shall include the full text of the measure so proposed. Initiative petitions for state-wide measures shall be filed 13 14 with the Secretary of State not less than four months one hundred fifty (150) 15 days before the election at which they are to be voted upon; provided, that 16 at least thirty (30) days before the aforementioned filing, the proposed 17 measure shall have been published once, at the expense of the petitioners, in 18 some paper of general circulation. 19 20 SECTION 2. The subsection of Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 1,

32 33 titled "Court Decisions" is amended to read as follows:

22 Court Decisions. (a)(1) A challenge to the sufficiency of the ballot 23 title of a petition shall be made no later than thirty (30) days after the approval of the ballot title required by law. 24

- (2) A challenge to the sufficiency of petition signatures shall be made no later than thirty (30) days after the petition is certified for the ballot.
- (b) If the sufficiency of any petition is challenged such cause shall be a preference cause and shall be tried at once, but the failure of the courts to decide prior to the printing of ballots for the election as to the sufficiency of any such petition, shall not prevent the question from being placed upon the ballot at the election named in such petition, nor militate against the validity of such measure, if it shall have been approved by a vote of the people.
