36	SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED	INTO THE ARKANSAS	

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARK 2 BUDGET ALLOCATION. Prior to July 1 of each fiscal year, the Legislative 3 Council or the Joint Budget Committee shall review the Parks and Tourism 4 Department's plan for the upcoming year of amounts to be disbursed for each 5 park or other entity from the funds appropriated for State Operations of this 6 Act. The request for review from the agency shall include amounts to be 7 disbursed for each entity for the upcoming fiscal year compared to the 8 current fiscal year's anticipated expenditures and the previous fiscal year's 9 actual expenditures with any additional detail as may be required by the 10 reviewing body. 17 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 19 MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in the Conservation Tax Appropriation 20 Section of this Act for Parks and Tourism Special Maintenance shall be 21 expended, after receiving prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council 22 or Joint Budget Committee, for a special maintenance program for the Park 23 System. The funds provided will be used for repair and upkeep of parks and 24 museum facilities that have been deferred due to lack of funds in the 25 individual budgets of the parks and museums.

26 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 27 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 28 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 29 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 30 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 31 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 32 has determined that the Department of Parks and Tourism may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Parks and 33 34 Tourism authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both 35 necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by 36 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee

The requirement of approval by the Legislative 2 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section or 3 the Special Maintenance line item. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to 8 purchase from "Maintenance and General Operations" appropriations provided by 9 this Act, uniforms for Parks personnel, Museum Services personnel, Tourist 10 Information Center personnel, and uniforms and blazers to be used by 11 employees of the Department of Parks and Tourism who are staffing sports 12 shows, travel shows and other special promotional programs and special theme 13 costumes or uniforms for state parks. Provided further, that any clothing 14 purchased under the provisions stated in this section shall remain the 15 property of the Department of Parks and Tourism and shall be surrendered upon 16 request of the Department or upon termination of employment of the individual 17 to whom the clothing was issued.

Of the funds appropriated to the 24 Department of Parks and Tourism for Tourism/Museum grants in the State 25 Operations Appropriation Section of this Act, the Department is authorized to 26 make grants to cities and counties on a one to one dollar matching basis, up 27 to \$15,000 in state funds per grant, for the purpose of feasibility studies 28 for tourism attractions. The Department is authorized to promulgate rules 29 and regulations for the administration of this tourism attraction feasibility 30 The Department of Parks and Tourism shall notify House and grant program. 31 Senate Legislators representing the district of the award recipient. 32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2016 33 2017 through June 30, 2017 2018. 34

35 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CONTRACTS. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to enter 2 into contracts with Department employees for the provision of golf lessons at the Department's golf courses, outside of the employees' normal working 3 4 hours. Employees shall be Class A members and/or apprentices of the 5 Professional Golfers' Association of America or the Ladies Professional Golf 6 Association. The Director of Arkansas State Parks shall authorize all 7 contracts in accordance with department standards and procedures for 8 concession and operating contracts. Compensation to employees is not 9 retirement eligible.

13 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SMALL 15 FESTIVAL FUNDING. The General Assembly acknowledges the economic benefits of 16 festivals which attract visitors and stimulate the growth of tourism and 17 businesses statewide.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Parks and Tourism to the contrary, the Department of Parks and Tourism shall dedicate, commit and budget annually one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the 2% tourism tax credited to the Tourism Development Trust Fund for expense, advertising, marketing or grants for small festivals in Arkansas communities of less than 10,500 people.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2016

28 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 29 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 30 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 31 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 32 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 33 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 34 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 35 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 36 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.
