4 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon 7 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher 8 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or 9 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 10 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 11 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 12 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 13 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 14 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 15 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used 16 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 17 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 18 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 19 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 20 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no 21 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 22 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 23 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 24 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 25 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. 26 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 27 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 28 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 29 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 30 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 31 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 32 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 33 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 34 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 35 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 36 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of

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1 utilize any appropriation authorized by the General Assembly for the purpose 2 of advertisement, promotion, or other activities designed to promote or 3 encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, the Health 4 Care Independence Program, or the Arkansas Works Program, including without 5 limitation: 6 (A) Unsolicited communications mailed to potential 7 recipients; 8 (B) Television, radio, or online commercials; 9 (C) Billboard or mobile billboard advertising; 10 (D) Advertisements printed in newspapers, magazines, or 11 other print media; and 12 (E) Internet websites and electronic media. 13 (2) This subsection does not prohibit the publicly supported 14 institutions of higher education from: 15 (A) Direct communications with licensed insurance agents; 16 (B) Solicited communications with potential recipients; 17 (C)(i) Responding to an inquiry regarding the coverage for 18 which a potential recipient might be eligible, including without limitation 19 providing educational materials or information regarding any coverage for 20 which the individual might qualify. 21 (ii) Educational materials and information 22 distributed under subdivision (c)(2)(C)(i) of this section shall contain only 23 factual information and shall not contain subjective statements regarding the 24 coverage for which the potential recipient might be eligible; and 25 (D) Using an Internet website for the exclusive purpose of 26 enrolling individuals in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, the 27 Health Care Independence Program, or the Arkansas Works Program. 28 (d) The publicly supported institutions of higher education shall not 29 apply for or accept any funds, including without limitation federal funds, 30 for the purpose of advertisement, promotion, or other activities designed to 31 promote or encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, 32 the Health Care Independence Program, or the Arkansas Works Program. 33 (e)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(2) of this section, the 34 publicly supported institutions of higher education shall not: 35 (A)(i) Except as provided in subdivision (e)(1)(A)(ii) of 36 this section, allocate, budget, expend, or utilize an appropriation

9 (B) Apply for or accept any funds, including without 10 limitation federal funds, for the purpose of funding activities of 11 navigators, guides, certified application counselors, and certified licensed 12 producers under the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace Navigator, Guide, 13 and Certified Application Counselors Act, Arkansas Code § 23-64-601 et seq.

14 (2) Subdivision (e)(1) of this section does not apply to
15 certified application counselors at health related institutions, including
16 without limitation the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences.

(f) An appropriation authorized by the General Assembly shall not be subject to the provisions allowed through reallocation of resources or transfer of appropriation authority for the purpose of transferring an appropriation to any other appropriation authorized for a publicly supported institutions of higher education to be allocated, budgeted, expended, or utilized in a manner prohibited by this section.

(g) The provisions of this section are severable, and the invalidity of any subsection or subdivision of this section shall not affect other provisions of the section that can be given effect without the invalid provision.

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(h) This section expires on June 30, 2017 2018.

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29 SECTION 42. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 30 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 31 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 32 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 33 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 34 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 35 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 36 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be

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- 1 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 43. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 44. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.
