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3	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that use of the new Peer Support		
5	benefit in the Arkansas Medicaid Program is hindered by the inability under		
6	current rules to hire individuals who have committed drug-related offenses;		
7	that individuals who have served jail time can often have the most success in		
8	reaching individuals struggling with substance abuse addiction; that		
9	substance abuse is a growing issue for the State of Arkansas; that barriers		
10	should be removed to give providers all necessary resources to combat		
11	substance abuse; and that this act is immediately necessary to allow the		
12	Department of Human Services to make administrative rules at the earliest		
13	possible date to ensure the employment of individuals with drug-related		
14	offenses in the Peer Support benefit, to help reach individuals struggling		
15	with substance abuse addiction, and to combat substance abuse addiction.		
16	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
17	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
18	become effective on:		
19	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
20	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
21	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
22	bill; or		
23	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
24	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
