1	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that delay in implementation of
3	this act would hinder the State Plant Board from enforcing egregious
4	violations during the 2019 growing season, which could have a detrimental
5	impact on the state's agricultural economy. Therefore, an emergency is
6	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the
7	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
8	<u>on:</u>
9	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
10	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
11	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
12	<pre>bill; or</pre>
13	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
14	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
