3	(b) The Medicaid reimbursement rate review shall:
4	(1) Ensure that Medicaid reimbursement rates under the service
5	categories reported to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services by the
6	department are reviewed at least once every four (4) years;
7	(2) Prioritize types of Medicaid providers;
8	(3) Consider:
9	(A) The availability and access to care in each geographic
10	region of the state; and
11	(B) The substantiality of Medicaid reimbursement rates
12	while attracting a sufficient number of healthcare providers to deliver
13	quality services; and

28	healthcare services with current Medicaid reimbursement rates; that a
29	reimbursement rate review in response to the increases in the minimum wage
30	should be implemented as soon as possible in order to allow Medicaid
31	providers to continue to provide services to Medicaid beneficiaries; that
32	this act requires the Department of Human Services to implement a
33	reimbursement rate review methodology and procedure; that this act requires
34	the department to establish a Medicaid reimbursement rate review; that the
35	establishment of the Medicaid reimbursement rate review may require the
36	<u>department to promulgate rules or submit a state plan amendment or waiver, or</u>

1	both; and that this act is immediately necessary because the department needs
2	to be able to promulgate rules or submit a state plan amendment request or
3	waiver request, or both, at the earliest possible date to ensure certainty in
4	the reimbursement rates of the Arkansas Medicaid Program. Therefore, an
5	emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for
6	the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
7	effective on:
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
11	<u>bill; or</u>
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
