35 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PARK

1 BUDGET ALLOCATION. Prior to July 1 of each fiscal year, the Legislative
2 Council or the Joint Budget Committee shall review the Parks and Tourism
3 Department's plan for the upcoming year of amounts to be disbursed for each
4 park or other entity from the funds appropriated for State Operations of this
5 Act. The request for review from the agency shall include amounts to be
6 disbursed for each entity for the upcoming fiscal year compared to the
7 current fiscal year's anticipated expenditures and the previous fiscal year's
8 actual expenditures with any additional detail as may be required by the
9 reviewing body. The Parks and Tourism Department shall also prepare a
10 semiannual status report for the reviewing body comparing six-month and

18 MAINTENANCE. The funds appropriated in the Conservation Tax Appropriation
19 Section of this Act for Parks and Tourism Special Maintenance shall be
20 expended, after receiving prior approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council
21 or Joint Budget Committee, for a special maintenance program for the Park
22 System. The funds provided will be used for repair and upkeep of parks and
23 museum facilities that have been deferred due to lack of funds in the
24 individual budgets of the parks and museums.

25 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of

30 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

32 MISSISSIPPI RIVER DOMESTIC - INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PLAN. Of the funds
33 appropriated to the Department of Parks and Tourism - Great River Road for
34 operating expenses in the State Operations Appropriation Section of this Act,
35 up to \$15,000 each year is authorized to be utilized for the implementation
36 of the Mississippi River Domestic - International Marketing Plan.

4 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

6 OF UNIFORMS. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to
7 purchase from "Maintenance and General Operations" appropriations provided by
8 this Act, uniforms for Parks personnel, Museum Services personnel, Tourist
9 Information Center personnel, and uniforms and blazers to be used by
10 employees of the Department of Parks and Tourism who are staffing sports
11 shows, travel shows and other special promotional programs and special theme
12 costumes or uniforms for state parks. Provided further, that any clothing
13 purchased under the provisions stated in this section shall remain the
14 property of the Department of Parks and Tourism and shall be surrendered upon
15 request of the Department or upon termination of employment of the individual
16 to whom the clothing was issued.

26 to \$15,000 in state funds per grant, for the purpose of feasibility studies

36 CONTRACTS. The Department of Parks and Tourism is hereby authorized to enter

3 hours. Employees shall be Class A members and/or apprentices of the
4 Professional Golfers' Association of America or the Ladies Professional Golf

14 FESTIVAL FUNDING. The General Assembly acknowledges the economic benefits of
15 festivals which attract visitors and stimulate the growth of tourism and

17 Notwithstanding any other provision of law or rules and regulations
18 promulgated by the Department of Parks and Tourism to the contrary, the
19 Department of Parks and Tourism shall dedicate, commit and budget annually

1 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE – CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 19,
2 Chapter 6, Subchapter 8 is amended to read as follows:

3 19-6-839. Arkansas Wine Grants Fund.

4 (a)(1) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
5 Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue
6 fund to be known as the “Arkansas Wine Grants Fund”.

7 (2) The Arkansas Wine Grants Fund shall consist of fees collected from
8 grocery store wine permits under § 3-5-1802 and shall be administered by the
9 Department of Finance and Administration.

10 (b) Fifty percent (50%) of fees that are deposited into the Arkansas Wine
11 Grants Fund under § 3-5-1802 shall be divided among the wineries seeking
12 grant payments under § 3-5-901 et seq., according to the same ratio as the
13 wine taxes paid in the previous calendar year by the grantee as determined by
14 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, not to exceed the amount paid in by
15 each grantee.

16 (c) Fifty percent (50%) of fees that are deposited into the Arkansas Wine
17 Grants Fund under § 3-5-1802 shall be transferred to the Tourism Development
18 Trust Fund for the purpose of land acquisition, construction, lease,
19 equipment acquisition, improvements, renovation, major maintenance, personal
20 services, maintenance, operating and staffing a wine tourism facility and
21 office space for the Arkansas Wine Producers Council within the tourism
22 facility in Franklin County, Arkansas.

23 (d) Any funds not obligated unused or undesignated fees at the end of the
24 fiscal year shall be transferred to the Tourism Development Trust Fund.

25
26 SECTION 30. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
27 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
28 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
29 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
30 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
31 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
32 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
33 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
34 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

35
36 SECTION 31. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General

1 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
2 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
3 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
4 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
5 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
6 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
7 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
8

9 SECTION 32. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
10 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
11 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
12 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
13 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
14 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
15 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
16 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
17 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
18 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
19 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
