4	SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. UAMS -
6	ADULT SICKLE CELL DISEASE PROGRAM. There is hereby established a new program
7	for the comprehensive care of Adult Sickle Cell Disease to be known as the
8	University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Adult Sickle Cell Disease
9	Program. The program will facilitate the continued development of adult
10	sickle cell disease treatment, preventive care, education, and training for
11	health care professionals and related personnel utilizing the University of
12	Arkansas for Medical Sciences' Area Health Education Centers throughout the
13	State and Center for Distance Health. Funding for the Program will be from
14	general revenue and cash funds from fees for services, donations, grants, and
15	federal funds. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences will not
16	assume responsibility for funding the Program until such time as the General
17	Assembly appropriates and funds the Program.
18	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2018}{1}$

21	SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
22	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DOMESTIC
23	VIOLENCE SHELTER GRANTS. The grants authorized in the Domestic Violence
24	Shelter Programs and Grants appropriation section of this act shall be
25	equally distributed to domestic violence shelters as determined by the
26	Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission. The Arkansas Child
27	Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission may adopt rules and regulations to
28	carry out the intent of the General Assembly regarding the grant
29	appropriations authorized in the Domestic Violence Shelter Programs and

Provided that any such allowance shall not exceed, for any 12 employee, an amount equal to two and one half (2 & 1/2) times that portion of the salary authorized by the General Assembly to be paid from the University 13 14 of Arkansas Medical Center Fund. 15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018

The University shall provide justification to the Arkansas 11 Department of Higher Education for the need to allocate titles from this 12 "growth pool". No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such 13 time as specific positions are requested by the University, approved by the 14 University Board or their designee, and approved by the Legislative Council 15 or Joint Budget Committee. Furthermore, the Office of Personnel Management 16 (OPM) of the Division of Management Services of the Department of Finance and 17 Administration the Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall establish 18 and maintain for the 2018-2019 2019-2020 fiscal year a pool of three hundred 19 (300) career service positions up to a Cl30. (b) The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is authorized to access the "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" positions authorized in

- 1 this Section at any time during the fiscal year when it is determined by the
- 2 Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, subject to the
- 3 review and approval by the Board of Trustees, that the need for additional
- 4 positions exists. Only medical or research positions shall be established
- 5 under this provision. The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for
- 6 Medical Sciences shall provide a quarterly report detailing the justification
- 7 of allocation of positions from this "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool"
- 8 to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, to the Department of Higher
- 9 Education, and to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
- 10 for review. The report shall also include an accounting of the names, titles
- 11 and salaries of personnel who have been employed in positions established
- 12 from this pool and the source and duration of funds associated with the
- 13 positions.
- 14 (c) If the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences requests
- 15 continuation of any "Clinical Expansion and Research Pool" position(s) as
- 16 established herein during the next fiscal year, the position(s) must be
- 17 requested as a new position(s) in the agency's budget request.
- 18 (d) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency
- 19 is the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by
- 20 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying job titles and the
- 21 maximum grade or salary attached to those titles. The General Assembly has
- 22 determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be
- 23 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution.
- 24 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing a position pool in
- 25 Subsection (a) of this Section and since the General Assembly has granted the
- 26 agency broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary and
- 27 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the utilization
- 28 of the position pool by requiring review of the Legislative Council or Joint
- 29 Budget Committee in the utilization of the position pool. Therefore, the
- 30 requirement of review by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is
- 31 not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of review by the
- 32 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a
- 33 court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is void.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
- 35 <u>2019</u> through June 30, 2019 <u>2020</u>.

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1 SECTION 44. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ON-CALL COMPENSATION. On-call duty or standby duty differential may be authorized 3 4 for a Classified or Non-Classified patient care employee whose job requires 5 him or her to provide services when there is no regularly scheduled staff 6 coverage. An employee shall not exceed 128 hours during any seven-day 7 period, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform 8 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the 9 appropriate compensation. 10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018 11 2019 through June 30, 2019 2020. 12 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 15 PSYCHIATRIC RESEARCH INSTITUTE & DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS REPORTS. The 16 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall report quarterly each 17 fiscal year to the Legislative Council on program activities and the 18 expenditure of funds from the Psychiatric Research Institute and Department 19 of Pediatrics appropriation for Building Effective Services for Trauma 20 programs for children and adolescents. 21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018 22 2019 through June 30, 2019 2020. 23 SECTION 46. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED 26 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event 27 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas 28 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric 29 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven 30 31 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as 32 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year 33 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to 34 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents 35 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical

Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide

- 1 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
- 2 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
- 3 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,
- 4 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
- 5 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
- 6 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
- 7 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
- 8 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
- 9 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
- 10 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
- 11 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
- 12 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
- 13 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
- 14 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
- 15 Pediatrics.
- 16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
- 17 <u>2019</u> through June 30, 2019 <u>2020</u>.

- 19 SECTION 47. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DHS AND
- 21 UAMS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The University of Arkansas for Medical
- 22 Sciences (UAMS) and the Department of Human Services shall enter into a
- 23 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to determine any reimbursement,
- 24 administrative charges or fees for the State Olmstead plan or for processing
- 25 or administration of State match funds charges as reimbursement funding for
- 26 federal financial participation under the Medicaid's Disproportionate Share
- 27 (DSH) reimbursement program or any other arrangements or agreements that
- 28 could benefit UAMS for Fiscal Year 2019 and forward upon prior review of the
- 29 Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint
- 30 Budget Committee.
- 31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
- 32 2019 through June 30, 2019 2020.

- 34 SECTION 48. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
- 35 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
- 36 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

1	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
2	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
3	Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
4	Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
5	State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
6	Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
7	with in disbursement of said funds.
8	
9	SECTION 49. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
10	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
11	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
12	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
13	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
14	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
15	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
16	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
17	
18	SECTION 50. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
19	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
20	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
21	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of
22	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
23	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
24	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
25	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
26	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
27	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
28	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
