- (B)(i) The term "new unit of instruction, research, or public service" used in this subsection includes establishment of a college, school, division, institute, center, department, new curricula, majors leading to a new degree program, or an extension service not presently included in the program of the institution a state-supported four-year institution of higher education.
- (ii) The term "New unit of instruction, research, or public service" does not include reasonable and moderate extensions, as defined by the board, of existing curricular research or public service programs which have a direct relationship to existing programs at the several public state-supported four-year institutions of higher learning education.
- (b) General revenues appropriated by the General Assembly shall not be expended for new programs that have not been recommended by the board.
