- 33 developed by the Commission that incorporates performance evaluation
- 34 standards. Employees reaching the maximum rate of pay for their respective
- 35 classifications may receive merit pay or cost of living adjustments in a lump
- 36 sum payment, provided adjustments are awarded; the additional compensation

- shall not be construed as exceeding the line item maximum for that classification.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018 2019 through June 30, 2019 2020.

- 6 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 8 PROMOTIONAL ITEMS. The Arkansas State Game and Fish Commission is hereby
- 9 authorized to purchase from the Maintenance & General Operation
- 10 Classifications in the Operations Appropriation provided by this Act for
- 11 promotional items in an amount not to exceed fifty thousand dollars
- 12 (\$50,000), as authorized by the Director of the Commission to meet fish and
- 13 wildlife conservations and education needs.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2019 through June 30 2020.

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Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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26 SECTION 18. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 27 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 28 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of 29 30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 31 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm 32 33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 34 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 35 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 36 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
