11 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY 13 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an 14 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus 15 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the 16 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an 17 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the 18 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and 19 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in 20 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing 21 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement 22 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted 23 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions. 24 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help 25 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be 26 assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus 27 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor 28 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help 29 pool positions.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
2019 through June 30, 2019 2020.

SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon
 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher

9

1 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or 2 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 3 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 4 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 5 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 6 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 7 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 8 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 9 10 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 11 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 12 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 13 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no 14 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 15 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 16 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 17 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 18 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.

19 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 20 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 21 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 22 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 23 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 24 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 25 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 26 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 27 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 28 powers under this section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate 29 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of 30 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this 31 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint section. 32 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement 33 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled 34 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is 35 void.

3 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In 5 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in 6 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide 7 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds 8 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official 9 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall, 10 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from 11 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds 12 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid 13 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

17 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK 19 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made 20 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out 21 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B), such documents as 22 may be necessary shall be processed so that funds may be transferred from the 23 Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account 24 from which the technical college draws its general revenue support. It is found and determined by the</u> 32 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u> 33 <u>the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the</u> 34 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of</u> 35 <u>the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in</u> 36 <u>the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the</u>

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1	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm
2	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
3	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
4	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
5	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019.
