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2	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the			
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the General Assembly is			
4	responsible for establishing the four (4) United States Congressional			
5	Districts in the state; that the United States Congressional Districts are			
6	based on the information provided by the federal decennial census by the			
7	United States Bureau of the Census; that the federal decennial census data			
8	delivery was delayed; that the establishment of the four (4) United States			
9	Congressional Districts is necessary to provide equal representation of the			
10	citizens of Arkansas in the United States Congress; and that this act is			
11	immediately necessary because the establishment of the four (4) United States			
12	Congressional Districts must occur in adequate time for the candidates to			
13	file for office and for the citizens of Arkansas to have a fair election.			
14	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately			
15	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall			
16	become effective on:			
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;			
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,			
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the			
20	<pre>bill; or</pre>			
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is			
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.			
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
