20	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
21	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the General Assembly is	
22	responsible for establishing the four (4) United States Congressional	
23	Districts in the state; that the United States Congressional Districts are	
24	based on the information provided by the federal decennial census by the	
25	United States Bureau of the Census; that the federal decennial census data	
26	delivery was delayed; that the establishment of the four (4) United States	
27	Congressional Districts is necessary to provide equal representation of the	
28	citizens of Arkansas in the United States Congress; and that this act is	
29	immediately necessary because the establishment of the four (4) United States	
30	Congressional Districts must occur in adequate time for the candidates to	
31	file for office and for the citizens of Arkansas to have a fair election.	
32	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately	
33	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall	
34	become effective on:	
35	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
36	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	

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1	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
2	<u>bill; or</u>		
3	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
4	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
