15 TO CREATE FUNDS; AND TO MAKE TRANSFERS TO
16 AND FROM FUNDS AND FUND ACCOUNTS.

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
20

21 SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is to amend the Revenue
22 Stabilization Law, § 19-5-101 et seq., create funds, and make transfers to
23 and from funds and fund accounts.
24

25 SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. (a) Notwithstanding
26 any other provisions of law, immediately upon the effective date of this act,
27 a new sub-fund within the Restricted Reserve Fund shall be established as the
28 “EBD or Contingency 3/5 Vote Set Aside” and all balances in the
29 Executive/Legislative 3/5 Vote Set Aside in the Restricted Reserve Fund as
30 authorized under Acts 2021, No. 1058, § 3(a)(1)(A), shall be transferred to
31 the EBD or Contingency 3/5 Vote Set Aside.

32 (b) Any disbursement of the funds in the EBD or Contingency 3/5 Vote
33 Set Aside may be used for transfers as set out in § 19-5-1263(c) and (d).

34 (c) On July 1, 2024, all unobligated funds remaining in the EBD or
35 Contingency 3/5 Vote Set Aside in the Restricted Reserve Fund, as established
36 in subsection (a) of this section, shall be transferred to the General



1 Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund.

2 (d)(1) The General Assembly finds:

3 (A) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and
4 funding for a state agency or institution each fiscal year is the prerogative
5 of the General Assembly;

6 (B) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and
7 funding for a state agency or institution is usually accomplished by
8 delineating the maximum amounts in the appropriation acts for the state
9 agency or institution and in the general revenue allocations authorized for
10 each relevant fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization
11 Law, § 19-5-101 et seq.; and

12 (C) The Restricted Reserve Fund has established procedures
13 for the transfer of funds to various funds and fund accounts for the
14 efficient and effective operation of state government.

15 (2)(A) It is necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly
16 maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or,
17 if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, as
18 provided in § 19-5-1263(c).

19 (B) The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council
20 or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget Committee, is not
21 a severable part of § 19-5-1263.

22 (C) If the requirement of approval by the Legislative
23 Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint Budget
24 Committee, is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, §
25 19-5-1263(c)-(e) are void in their entirety.

26
27 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE.
28 FUNDING TRANSFER. (a) Immediately upon the effective date of this act as
29 soon thereafter as is practical after all transfers from the General Revenue
30 Allotment Reserve Fund enacted by the 93rd General Assembly meeting in the
31 2022 Fiscal Session are transferred, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
32 shall transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the
33 Auditor of the State the sum of one hundred fifty million dollars
34 (\$150,000,000) from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the
35 Majority Vote Various Improvements and Projects Set-Aside in the Restricted
36 Reserve Fund established in subsection (b) herein.

1 (b) The transfer of funds as authorized in subsection (a) herein shall be
 2 set aside in a sub-fund of the Restricted Reserve Fund named the Majority
 3 Vote Various Improvements and Projects Set-Aside.

4 (c) Notwithstanding other provisions of law as set out in 19-5-1263(c) the
 5 Majority Vote Various Improvements and Projects Set-Aside in the Restricted
 6 Reserve Fund shall only require a majority affirmative vote as set out in the
 7 rules of the Legislative Council or the Joint Budget Committee during a
 8 legislative session for prior approval of the requested disbursement as
 9 authorized in 19-5-1263(d).

10 (d) On July 1, 2023 all unobligated funds remaining in the "Majority Vote
 11 Various Improvements and Projects Set-Aside" in the Restricted Reserve Fund,
 12 as established in subsection (b) herein, shall be transferred to the General
 13 Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund.

 15 SECTION 4. Uncodified Acts 2021, No. 1058, § 2(c), is amended to read
 16 as follows:

17 (c)~~(1)~~ Any unobligated or unallocated funds remaining on July 2,
 18 2021, in the "General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund" from monies accruing
 19 thereto which are not required to finance enactments of the 93rd General
 20 Assembly that do not expire on June 30, 2021, including all General Revenue
 21 Funds recovered from remaining fund balances;

22 ~~(2) All General Revenue Funds recovered from remaining fund~~
 23 ~~balances in the "General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund" from monies accruing~~
 24 ~~thereto during the 2021-2022 fiscal year which are not required to finance~~
 25 ~~enactments of the 93rd General Assembly that do not expire on June 30, 2022,~~
 26 ~~including all General Revenue Funds recovered from remaining fund balances;~~

 28 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 19-5-401 is amended to read as follows:

29 19-5-401. Allocations for fiscal year 2022-2023 and thereafter.
 30 Commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and each fiscal year
 31 thereafter, the Treasurer of State shall transfer all remaining general
 32 revenues available for distribution on the last day of business in July 2022,
 33 and on the last day of business in each calendar month thereafter during the
 34 fiscal year to the various funds and fund accounts participating in general
 35 revenues in the proportions of the maximum allocation as the individual
 36 allocation to the fund or fund account bears to the total of the maximum

1 allocation as provided in § 19-5-402 (a) and (b).

2

3 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 19-5-402 is amended to read as follows:

4 19-5-402. Maximum allocations of revenues for fiscal year 2022-2023 and
5 thereafter.

6 (a) ALLOCATION A. The Treasurer of State shall first make monthly
7 allocations in the proportions set out in this subsection to the funds and
8 fund accounts listed below until there has been transferred a total of five
9 billion six hundred eighty five million seven hundred forty three thousand
10 two hundred and eighty five dollars (\$5,685,743,285) or so much thereof as
11 may become available; provided, that the Treasurer of State shall make such
12 monthly allocations in accordance with each fund or fund account's
13 proportionate part of the total of all such allocations set forth in this
14 subsection:

5 SECTION 7. DO NOT CODIFY. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It
6 is the intent that Section (c)(2) in Act 1058 of 2021 is repealed in Section
7 4 of this Act because under that subsection of Arkansas Code all surplus
8 funds from Fiscal Year 2022 would have deposited into the Catastrophic
9 Reserve Fund and the Arkansas Code was amended in a subsequent special
10 session to provide a potentially conflicting procedure that the Catastrophic
11 Reserve Fund shall be funded with surplus funds to maintain a level of at
12 least twenty percent of the previous fiscal years funding and for surplus
13 funds also be provided to the Department of Transportation in an amount of
14 twenty-five percent of the available surplus, up to fifty million dollars,
15 and any remaining funds be deposited into the General Revenue Allotment
16 Reserve fund, where they may only be transferred out as authorized by the
17 General Assembly.

19 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
20 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that uncodified Acts 2021, No. 1058, §
21 2(c), provides for the transfer of certain funds in the General Revenue
22 Allotment Reserve Fund to the Restricted Reserve Fund or the Rainy Day Fund;
23 that the General Assembly has determined that this transfer of funds is not
24 necessary and that other uses of the funds will preserve the public peace,
25 health, and safety; and that Sections 4 and 7 this act should become
26 effective at the earliest opportunity to take effect before the transfer of
27 funds under uncodified Acts 2021, No. 1058, § 2(c), occurs. Therefore, an
28 emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for
29 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become
30 effective on:

31 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

32 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
33 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
34 bill; or

35 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
36 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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SECTION 9. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DUPLICATE ACTS. If HB1117 and SB101 of the 2022 Fiscal Session of the 93rd General Assembly are both enacted and adopted by the 93rd General Assembly in identical form, then the last Act passed or latest expression shall supersede the other.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, and 9 of this act are effective on and after July 1, 2022.
