6 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. R.I.S.E. 8 ARKANSAS - CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for 9 R.I.S.E. Arkansas remaining on June 30, 2024 2025, in the Division of 10 Elementary and Secondary Education Public School Fund Account shall be 11 designated and retained for the R.I.S.E. Arkansas. Any carry forward of 12 unexpected balance of funding as authorized herein, may be carried forward 13 under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2024 2025 the Agency shall by written statement
set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

17 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall 18 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee all 19 amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or 20 Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the 21 Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding 22 carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source of that 23 appropriation and a copy of the written request set forth in item (1) above;

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 5 FUND ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in the 6 Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this 7 Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated Funding 8 that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special 9 Needs Isolated Funding in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and 10 Special Programs section of this Act and shall be used there for fully 11 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code § 6-20-604 on a pro 12 rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro rata basis is defined 13 as providing each district qualifying for additional funding under 14 subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how each 15 district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional funding 16 amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and appropriation 17 remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code § 6-18 20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the provisions of Arkansas 19 Code § 6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the available funds are 20 exhausted.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 24 25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 26 GRANTS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To 27 School Districts appropriation in the Grants and Aid to Local School 28 Districts and Special Programs section of this Act, "school district" means a 29 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 30 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 31 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 32 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 33 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 34 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 35 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 36 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school

1 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 2 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in the Grants and Aid to 3 Local School Districts and Special Programs section of this Act to such 4 school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating the 5 pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The payments 6 are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such school 7 districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department of 8 Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation as 9 is deemed necessary.

10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2023
11 <u>2024</u> through June 30, 2024 <u>2025</u>.

SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 15 SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special 16 Education Services" in the Grants and Aid to Local School Districts and 17 Special Programs section of this Act shall be used to provide extended year 18 summer programs for handicapped students in need of such services, to provide 19 special education services to foster children who are wards of the State, and 20 to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education 21 supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute such funds in the 22 manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2023
24 <u>2024</u> through June 30, 2024 <u>2025</u>.

26 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 28 TRANSFER AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the 29 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the 30 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized 31 to request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 32 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 33 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 34 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

35 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 36 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year

1 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 2 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 3 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 4 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 5 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 6 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 7 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 8 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 9 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 10 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The 11 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 12 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 13 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 14 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

18 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

AETN DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -

24 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 25 Quiz Bowl.

SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 29 30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 31 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School 32 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any 33 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the 34 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for 35 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the 36 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,

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Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the
 Department of Correction.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2023
4 <u>2024</u> through June 30, 2024 <u>2025</u>.

6 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 8 BETTER CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is 9 hereby authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds 10 for administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available 11 funds shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees 12 to ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of 13 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek 14 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 15 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the 16 Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds 17 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of 18 Elementary and Secondary Education to administer the program.

19 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 20 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 21 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2023

10 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 12 ARKANSAS/STRIVE PROGRAM TRANSFER. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the State 13 14 Auditor, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) during each 15 fiscal year from the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Public 16 School Fund Account to the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, 17 specifically to provide funding for the Arkansas/STRIVE Program. The total 18 amount of funds transferred each fiscal year pursuant to this section shall 19 not be subject to any indirect costs by the University of Arkansas at Little 20 Rock.

Not less than one million dollars 9 (\$1,000,000) of the three million five thousand dollars (\$3,005,000) or 10 eighteen percent (18%) of the Technology Grants Line Item awarded to the EAST 11 Initiatives shall be used for EAST infrastructure and personnel growth for 12 the establishment of new programs. Any appropriation titled 13 "ENHANCED STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT FUNDING" or abbreviated as "ESA" as named by 14 SB605 of 2019 may also be known as "NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH" funding or 15 abbreviated as "NSL" and shall be used for the same purposes as set out in 16 law.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2023
<u>2024</u> through June 30, 2024 <u>2025</u>.

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20 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 22 ARKANSAS GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL CURRICULUM. Prior to the beginning of the 23 Arkansas Governor's School Program each year, the Arkansas Department of 24 Education shall review and approve the proposed curriculum for the program 25 year and shall maintain oversight of its implementation for consistency and 26 accuracy.

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30 SECTION 25. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 31 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 32 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 33 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 34 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 35 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 36 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 1 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 2 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 26. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. SECTION 27. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2024 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2024 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2024.
