5 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS 7 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the 8 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized 9 services and programs.

For employees hired on or after July 3 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below, 4 the Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services Director shall 5 implement salary adjustments utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers 6 employed by the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Aging, Adult, and
Behavioral Health Services is authorized to pay special rates of pay for
classifications at the Arkansas State Hospital listed below:

13 Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that 14 is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required, 15 be provided by a transfer from the Performance Fund to the proper fund or 16 fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of 17 the State. The Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services 18 shall in addition to the funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service 19 Recognition Payments from the Performance Fund, make available any funding 20 generated from agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund 21 accounts as provided by law.

22 For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State 23 Hospital in the classifications listed above, the Division of Aging, Adult, 24 and Behavioral Health Services Director shall set the number of work days for 25 the employment year to equal the number of days worked by those employed in 26 the same classifications at the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf. The 27 accrual, use, and carryover of sick days, personal days, and holidays of the 28 employees at the Arkansas State Hospital that are hired on or after July 1, 29 2013, or current employees choosing to adopt this plan, shall be treated in 30 the same manner as those employed in the same classifications at the Arkansas 31 Schools for the Blind and Deaf.

Those currently employed at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed above as of June 30, 2013, have the one-time option of adopting this language or continuing to operate under the same salary, leave and benefit plans they are currently receiving. Employees must make their decision by June 30, 2013.

Accrued annual and holiday leave, up to 240 hours, as of June 30, 2013, will be paid out to current employees choosing to adopt this plan. Any additional accrued annual and holiday leave will be forfeited. Accrued sick leave, as of June 30, 2013, shall be retained on file and shall be exhausted before any newly accrued sick leave may be taken.

All employees affected by this section shall be eligible to receivehazardous duty pay for time worked in eligible areas.

11 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD - COMMUNITY BASED CRISIS INTERVENTION. Any unexpended balance of 13 14 funds allocated for Community Based Crisis Intervention in the Department of 15 Human Services - Division of Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services 16 from the Behavioral Health Services Fund Account which remains at the close 17 of each state fiscal year shall be carried forward to the next state fiscal 18 year to be used for the same intent and purposes as set forth in law. Any 19 carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein may be 20 carried forward under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2023 2024, the Agency shall, by written
statement, set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding
to the Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the
September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting
which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission, or

SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 10 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AGING AND 12 ADULT SERVICES - MATCHING FUNDS. The funds appropriated for state match for 13 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act shall be paid on a two-to-14 one state/local matching basis. The Senior Arkansas Sports Organization must 15 certify its portion of the match to the Division of Aging, Adult, and 16 Behavioral Health Services before any funds appropriated for state match for 17 the Arkansas Senior Olympics Program in this Act are disbursed.

AGING AND 23 ADULT SERVICES - NURSING HOME CARE ALTERNATIVES. Funding for "Nursing Home 24 Care Alternatives", as it appears in the Aging and Adult Services -25 Operations appropriation may be used for home delivered meals, adult day 26 care, homemaker/chore, respite care, personal care, health promotion, and 27 other community-based activities. These funds may also be used to match 28 Medicaid community-based programs.

32 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENIOR 34 CITIZEN CENTERS. The appropriation in this act for Senior Citizen Centers 35 shall be distributed in the same manner as the funding formula requirements 36 set out in the federal Older Americans Act funding law. The additional

funding provided by this provision shall supplement and not supplant any
 monies currently funding services for Senior Citizen Centers.

CARRY 13 14 FORWARD OF UNOBLIGATED GENERAL REVENUE FUNDS FOR SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS. (a) 15 On June 30, 2019, or as soon as is practicable to determine funds available 16 as authorized in this Section, and each fiscal year thereafter the Chief 17 Fiscal Officer of the State shall cause to be transferred on his or her books 18 and those of the State Treasurer and Auditor of State the balance of 19 unobligated general revenue funds, excluding funds carried forward for other 20 purposes, remaining in the Fund or Fund Accounts and the corresponding paying 21 accounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as set out 22 in subsection (b) herein, to the Department of Human Services - Division of 23 Aging, Adult, and Behavioral Health Services paying account to be used 24 exclusively for the disbursement of funds for Senior Citizen Centers in the 25 amount of recouped and recovered general revenue not to exceed five hundred 26 thousand dollars (\$500,000).

28 SECTION 21. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 29 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 30 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 31 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 32 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 33 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 34 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 35 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 36 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

2 SECTION 22. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 3 4 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 5 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 6 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 7 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 8 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 9 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 10 11 SECTION 23. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 12 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 13 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2024 is essential to the operation of 14 15 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 16 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 17 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2024 could work irreparable harm
