ABSTRACT—This information provides the process for textbook adoption relating to the Arkansas Curriculum Frameworks. Legislations regarding textbook adoption and the use of textbooks in the state are included, in addition to a complete list of science textbooks adopted by Arkansas school districts.

SUBJECT: Textbooks/Instructional - Relationship to and Utilization with Textbooks

State Textbook/Instructional Materials Selecting Committees' recommend, to the Arkansas Board of Education, a wide range of textbooks and other instructional materials on all levels of difficulty with diversity of appeal, and that most important, are consistent with the curriculum and educational goals (framework and standards') established by the Board. They will reject any materials that are not consistent with the curriculum and educational goals established by the Board.

Members of the State Committees' will be guided solely on the teaching merits and content of the texts and instructional materials, whether they are current, and whether they are consistent with the curriculum and educational goals and the bias free guidelines adopted by the Board. Questions of price and manufacturer specifications will not be a concern of the reviewing committees.

Attached is a report that shows the Report of Local Adoptions for Science, Grades K-12, for Adoption Cycle 7/01/07 -6/30/13. This report shows the publishing companies who participated and had instructional materials adopted, and it provides the adoption choices that were made by the local school districts.

Also attached are copies of Legislative Acts pertaining to textbooks/instructional materials.

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated § 6-21-402 is hereby amended to read
as follows:

"6-21-402. Definitions.

(a) As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires,
'instructional materials' include traditional books and trade books in printed
and bound form; activity-oriented programs that may include manipulatives,
hand-held calculators, or other hands-on materials; and technology-based
materials that require the use of electronic equipment in order to be used in
the learning process.

(b) Technology-based materials do not include the equipment required to
make use of these materials."

33 bids whether it wants current wholesale prices or lowest contract prices.

34 (E) In the bid and contract form, the publisher shall certify the
35 date on which the current wholesale prices were established and submit a list
36 of all existing adoption bids showing such items as may be requested by the

8 whenever a contract is made at a lower price in another state after the date
9 of contract in Arkansas.

10 (H) If any publisher makes a contract on a special or state
11 edition in another state after the date of contract in Arkansas, the State
12 Board of Education is authorized to require the publisher to supply the
13 special or state edition to the schools of Arkansas at the contract price in
14 other states.

15 (I) The State Board of Education is authorized to require a
16 publisher to bid an exchange price on all basal or supplementary textbooks
17 bids, and all the price regulations in this subchapter applying to regular
18 contracts shall also apply to exchange prices;

19 (2)(A) The person, company, or corporation shall deposit a copy of each
20 textbook and other instructional material in printed or manuscript form in the
21 office of the Director of General Education.

~~22~~ (B) All publishers doing business in the state of Arkansas shall
23 maintain one (1) or more book depositories at the publisher's expense in
24 Arkansas.

25 (C) All items offered for sale in Arkansas pursuant to this
26 subchapter shall be equal in quality to those deposited in the office of the
27 Director of General Education and shall meet the minimum standards and
28 specifications set forth by the State Board of Education."

15 certifies that the price is no higher than the lowest contract prices the

18 contracts for no less than one (1) year nor more than two (2) years. This
19 provision shall be made a part of the publisher's contract, and the State
20 Board of Education may exercise the provision by notifying the publisher no
21 less than one (1) year prior to the expiration of the original contract."

 19 corporation, or any agent thereof, offering for sale any item pursuant to this
 20 subchapter, or from any person in any way interested in such sale.

21 (2) Any person who pleads guilty, nolo contendere, or is found
 22 guilty of violating this subsection shall be subject to a fine not to exceed
 23 five hundred dollars (\$500) or imprisonment in the county jail for a period
 24 not to exceed six (6) months or both.

25 (3) Any fines collected under this subsection shall be deposited
 26 in the State Treasury to the credit of the Public School Fund.

27 (b)(1) It shall be illegal for any teacher in the public schools of
 28 Arkansas, any county supervisor or city superintendent of schools, any member
 29 of any school board or board of education, or any person connected with the
 30 public school system of Arkansas in any capacity to have any interest in the
 31 profits, proceeds, or sale of any school textbooks or other instructional
 32 materials used in the schools of Arkansas under his charge or with which he is
 33 connected in any official capacity, provided that this provision shall not
 34 apply nor have any reference to royalties or fees received by a person from
 35 the sale of school books or other instructional materials of which he is the
 36 author.

(1) In each instance in which the estimated purchase price shall equal or exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), the commodity shall be procured by soliciting bids, provided that the purchasing official may reject all bids and may purchase the commodity by negotiating a contract. If the purchasing official, after rejecting all bids, determines that the purchase should be made by negotiation, then each responsible bidder who submitted a bid shall be notified of the determination and shall be given a reasonable opportunity to negotiate;

(2) Open market purchases may be made where the purchase price is less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000);

(3) No purchasing official shall parcel or split any item or items with the intent or purpose to enable the purchase to be made under a less restrictive procedure."

"6-21-404. Duties of State Board of Education Generally.

(a) The State Board of Education is authorized and empowered to:

(1) Make rules and regulations to implement this subchapter and provide for a statewide textbook selection committee;

(2) Require reports from school districts on the use and distribution of these items;
and

(3) Do whatever else may be necessary for the general welfare of the public school textbook and instructional materials system in order to acquire such items at the lowest possible cost.

(b) The powers enumerated in this section are cumulative and not restrictive.

(c) The state board shall have power to include any additional regulations in the bid and contract form that the state board deems best for the administration of this subchapter, and any regulations included in the bid and contract forms and accepted by the publisher shall be constructed as a part of this subchapter.

(d) Publishers shall be required to comply with the additional regulations as if they were included in this subchapter.

(e) Publishers must sell their materials at the same price to all schools and districts in the state and guarantee that price for the life of a state adoption cycle."

(c) If a school district selects other instructional material not recommended by the state, the district shall certify to the department by June of each year which instructional materials the district wishes to purchase by state contract from the state-recommended list.

(d) If a school district selects other instructional materials not recommended by the state, the district may purchase such materials outside any state contract."
