## **SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

7 DECLARING THE SOVEREIGNTY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS UNDER  
8 THE 10TH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED  
9 STATES AND PETITIONING CONGRESS TO CEASE AND DESIST  
10 MANDATES THAT ARE BEYOND THE SCOPE OF ITS  
11 CONSTITUTIONALLY-DELEGATED POWERS.

### **Subtitle**

14 DECLARING THE SOVEREIGNTY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS UNDER  
15 THE 10TH AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED  
16 STATES AND PETITIONING CONGRESS TO CEASE AND DESIST  
17 MANDATES THAT ARE BEYOND THE SCOPE OF ITS  
18 CONSTITUTIONALLY-DELEGATED POWERS.

21 WHEREAS, the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States  
22 reads as follows:

23 "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor  
24 prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States  
25 respectively, or to the people."; and

26 WHEREAS, the 10th Amendment defines the total scope of federal power as  
27 being that specifically granted by the United States Constitution and no more;  
28 and

29 WHEREAS, the scope of power defined by the 10th Amendment means that the  
30 federal government was created by the states specifically to be an agent of  
31 the states; and

32 WHEREAS, today, in 1994, the states are demonstrably treated as agents  
33 of the federal government; and

34 WHEREAS, numerous resolutions have been forwarded to the federal  
35 government by the Arkansas General Assembly without any response or result

1 from Congress or the federal government; and

2 WHEREAS, many federal mandates are directly in violation of the 10th

3 Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; and

4 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court has ruled in New York v. United

5 States, 112 S. Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply commandeer the

6 legislative and regulatory processes of the states; and

7 WHEREAS, a number of proposals from previous administrations and some

8 now pending from the present administration and from Congress may further

9 violate the United States Constitution;

11 NOW THEREFORE,

12 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE SECOND EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE

13 SEVENTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF

14 REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

15 (1) That the State of Arkansas hereby claims sovereignty under the 10th

16 Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over all powers not

17 otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal government by the United

18 States Constitution.

19 (2) That this serve as Notice and Demand to the federal government, as

20 our agent, to cease and desist, effective immediately, mandates that are

21 beyond the scope of its constitutionally delegated powers.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be sent by the

23 Secretary of the Senate to the President of the United States, the Speaker of

24 the United States House of Representatives, the President of the United States

25 Senate, the presiding officers of each chamber of the legislatures of the

26 several states, and Arkansas\_ Congressional Delegation.
