19	(a) To be qualified to vote, a person shall have registered at least	
20	thirty (30) calendar days immediately prior to the election and in the manne	
21	set forth by Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 51.	
22	(b) "Voting residence" shall be a voter's domicile and shall be	
23	governed by the following provisions:	
24	(1) The domicile of a person is that place in which his or her	
25	habitation is fixed to which he or she has the intention to return whenever	
26	he or she is absent;	
27	(2) A change of domicile is made only by the act of abandonment,	
28	joined with the intent to remain in another place. A person can have only one	
29	(1) domicile at any given time;	
30	(3) A person does not lose his or her domicile if he or she	
31	temporarily leaves his or her home and goes to another country, state, or	
32	place in this state with the intent of returning;	
33	(4) The place where a person's family resides is presumed to be	
34	his or her place of domicile, but a person may acquire a separate residence	
35	if he or she takes another abode with the intention of remaining there;

34	(a) If the voter is listed on the precinct voter registration list but	
35	fails to provide proof of identity, the election official shall:	
36	(1) Indicate on the precinct voter registration list that the	

1	voter did not provide proof of identity; and	
2	(2) Permit the voter to cast a provisional ballot.	
3	(b)(1) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing home, licensed	
4	residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility, or any licensed	
5	facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is not required to	
6	provide proof of identity before voting.	
7	(2) A person not required to provide proof of identity under	
8	subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall provide documentation from the	
9	administrator of the facility attesting that the person is a resident of the

11	(c) A provisional ballot cast by a voter who did not provide proof of	
12	identity shall be counted only if:

24	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 7-5-418 is amended to read as follows:	
25	7-5-418. Early voting.	
26	(a)(1)(A) Except as provided in subdivision (a)(1)(B) of this section,	
27	early voting shall be available to any qualified elector who applies to the	
28	county clerk's designated early voting location, beginning fifteen (15) days	
29	before a preferential primary or general election between the hours of 8:00	
30	a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.	
31	Saturday and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election.	
32	(B) Early voting shall not be available on state or county	
33	holidays.	
34	(2) However, on all other elections, including presidential	
35	preferential primary, general primary, and general runoff elections, early	
36	voting shall be available to any qualified elector who applies to the county	

- 1 clerk during regular office hours, beginning seven (7) days before the
- 2 election and ending on the day before the election day at the time the county
- 3 clerk's office regularly closes.
- 4 (b)(1)(A) The county board of election commissioners may decide to
- 5 hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the offices of the
- 6 county clerk on any of the days and times provided for in subsection (a) of
- 7 this section, if it so chooses.
- 8 (B) The county board shall determine by unanimous vote the
- 9 location of additional polling sites for early voting.
- 10 (2) The county board shall appoint the election officials for the
- 11 additional early voting polling site or sites in the same manner as election
- 12 officials are appointed for election day.
- 13 (3)(A) The county board shall notify the county clerk of its decision
- 14 to hold early voting at additional polling sites outside the office of the
- 15 county clerk within ten (10) days of the decision.
- 16 (B)(i) If the county board decides to hold early
- 17 voting at additional polling sites outside the office of the county clerk,
- 18 the county clerk may choose not to hold early voting within the office of the
- 19 county clerk. The county clerk shall notify the county board within ten (10)

- 20 (2)(A) If the voter fails to provide proof of identity, the

- 22 (B)(i) A person who is a resident of a licensed nursing
- 23 home, licensed residential care facility, licensed assisted-living facility,
- or any licensed facility that provides long-term medical or personal care is
- 25 <u>not required to provide proof of identity before voting.</u>
- 26 <u>(ii) A person not required to provide proof of</u>
- 27 identity under subdivision (d)(2)(B)(i) of this section shall provide
- 28 documentation from the administrator of the facility attesting that the
- 29 person is a resident of the facility.
- 30 (e) The county clerk or county board shall furnish voting locations
- 31 that adequately allow the early voter to personally and secretly execute his
- 32 or her ballot.
- 33 (f) Upon casting his or her ballot, the voter shall then deposit the
- 34 ballot in the appropriate box in the same manner as for votes cast on the day
- 35 of the election.
- 36 (g) Except as provided in this section, early voting shall be

1	conducted in the same manner as voting on election day. Conduct that is
2	prohibited or restricted on election day shall be subject to the same
3	prohibitions and restrictions on the days on which early voting is conducted.
4	
5	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 27-16-805(a), concerning the fee for an
6	identification card, is amended to read as follows:
7	(a)(1) The Office of Driver Services of the Department of Finance and
8	Administration may issue an identification card to those Arkansas residents
9	five (5) years of age or older who are not licensed drivers.
10	(2)(A) The fee for the card shall be five dollars (\$5.00) The
11	Office of Driver Services shall not impose a fee on an individual who meets
12	the requirements of subdivision (a)(2)(B) of this section for the issuance
13	of:
14	(i) An original identification card;
15	(ii) A renewal of an identification card; or
16	(iii) A duplicate identification card.
17	(B) An identification card shall be issued without the
18	payment of a fee or charge to an individual who:
19	(i) Does not have a valid Arkansas driver's license;
20	<u>and</u>
21	(ii) Will be at least eighteen (18) years of age at
22	the next general election, special election, or municipal election.
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
