- (2) Members of the Department of Arkansas State Police are charged with the duty of excluding from the public highways of this state all trucks or vehicles hauling coal in violation of this act.
- (3) This act is not intended to repeal any existing laws against illegal use of the highways by trucks or vehicles, but it shall be cumulative of all existing laws or such other laws as may be hereafter enacted.
- (4) If any person at the time of his arrest shall have possession of a truck or vehicle being operated in violation of this act, the vehicle and the coal contained therein shall be seized by the arresting officer and held as evidence until released by the court, but not until after the coal has been weighed and a record made of the coal and truck, as is required by this act.

- 15-59-103. Rules and regulations.
- (a) A representative of the Department of Arkansas State Police, a representative of the United Mine Workers of America District 21, and a representative of the Arkansas-Oklahoma Coal Operators Association, to be named by the respective associations shall make and promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for carrying this act into effect.
- (b) A copy of the rules and regulations shall be kept on file in the office of the Department of Arkansas State Police.
- (c) They shall designate the location of scales and name official coal weighers to weigh the coal, so as to afford weighing facilities at the mines, or as near the mines as may be practicable and convenient to coal producers, coal buyers, and coal sellers and to persons, firms, corporations, and associations engaged in transporting coal over the public highways, streets, and alleys.
- (d) They shall also make and promulgate reasonable rules and regulations for the guidance of official weighers provided for herein in weighing coal and in making and keeping records of weights, of vehicles used in the transportation of coal, and of the movement of those vehicles over and upon public highways, streets, and alleys.
- (e) When the rules and regulations have been made and promulgated, they shall have the binding force and effect of a law. A violation of the rules and regulations shall be deemed to be a misdemeanor and punishable as provided in this act.

2	15-59-104. Coal sold by predelivery weight.
3	It shall be the duty of every corporation, person, firm, or association
4	engaged in the business of mining coal in this state to sell coal by weight
5	and to cause the coal to be accurately weighed by an authorized weigher
6	before delivery to any purchaser thereof or to any person whomsoever for
7	transportation.
8	
9	15-59-105. Prohibition on transferring coal before weighing.
10	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or
11	association to transport coal in trucks or other vehicles from a mine over
12	the public highways, streets, or alleys in the State of Arkansas before the
13	coal has been weighed by an official coal weigher as provided in this
14	chapter, except, in cases where the coal is being moved from a mine to the
15	nearest official weigher or where the coal is being transported from a mine
16	to a railroad car to be loaded thereon and weighed and shipped in due course
17	of business.
18	(b) Any person operating scales that have been tested and sealed as
19	provided by the general law shall be, upon demand, authorized as a weigher
20	under the provisions of this act and be permitted to charge sums for this
21	service as agreed to between the weigher and the transporter of coal.

23	<del>15-59-106. Official weighers.</del>
24	(a) All official coal weighers shall be appointed by the Department of
25	Arkansas State Police, and they shall hold office until their services as
26	weighers are terminated by the Department of Arkansas State Police.
27	(b)(1) Each official weigher, before entering upon the discharge of
28	his duties, shall take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation to the effect
29	that:
30	(A) He is a citizen of the State of Arkansas;
31	(B) He resides in County, the county in which
32	he proposes to act as official weigher;
33	(C) He is a qualified elector of the state;
34	(D) He will honestly and correctly weigh all coal brought
35	to him to be weighed; and
36	(F) He will faithfully discharge his duties as official

1 weigher and truly and correctly record and certify to such weights. 2 (2) The oath or affirmation may be administered by the state mine inspector or by any officer authorized by law to administer oaths in 3 4 this state. 5 (c)(1) The official weigher shall also make and execute a bond to the 6 State of Arkansas, for the use and benefit of all persons who may suffer 7 damage on account of the neglect of duty of the official weigher. 8 (2) The bond shall be in the penal sum of one thousand dollars 9 (\$1,000) with good and sufficient surety thereon, to be approved by the 10 Department of Arkansas State Police. 11 (3) Any person, firm, corporation, or association suffering damage by reason of any neglect of official duty by the official weigher 12 13 shall have a right of action against him and the sureties on his bond. 14 (4) The Department of Arkansas State Police may, in its 15 discretion, accept as sureties on the bond any bonding company authorized to 16 do business in this state, or individuals. 17 (5) The bond, when approved, shall be filed in the office of the 18 county clerk of the county in which the official weigher resides, and it 19 shall be recorded and kept on file as other official bonds are now kept. 20 (6) A certified copy of the bond shall be sufficient for all 21 purposes whatsoever. 2.2 23 15-59-107. Fees for weighing coal. 24 (a) The official coal weigher shall charge, demand, and receive for 25 his services in weighing and certifying to the weights of coal as provided in 26 this chapter, the sum of not more than twenty cents (20¢) per ton of two 27 thousand pounds (2,000 lbs.) thereof weighed by him to be fixed by the rules 28 provided for in § 15-59-103. 29 (b) He shall receive twenty cents (20¢) for each load of coal weighed 30 by him where the coal weighed is less than one (1) ton of two thousand pounds (2,000 lbs.). 31 32 (c) Fees shall be paid by the person having the coal weighed and at 33 the time the coal is weighed. 34 (d) The coal weigher shall receive no other fees or remuneration for 35 his services in weighing the coal or certifying to the weights as provided in 36 this chapter or for performing the duties required of him under this act, or

3	15-59-108. Certificates — Issuance and contents.	
4	(a) The official coal weigher shall weigh accurately all coal brought	
5	to him to be weighed and shall truthfully certify to the correct weights	
6	thereof on the forms prescribed in the rules made and promulgated pursuant to	
7	<del>§ 15-59-103.</del>	
8	(b) Certificates shall show:	
9	(1) The date the coal was weighed, the name and address of the	
10	seller, and the name of the mine from which the coal was removed;	
11	(2) The name and address of the buyer and the destination of the	
12	coal;	
13	(3) The name and address of the person in charge of the truck or	
14	other vehicle in which the coal is being transported; and	
15	(4) The gross weight of the load, the tare of the truck or

25	(a) The certificate provided for in this chapter shall be made out by	
26	the official weigher with a pen and ink or other indelible substance, so that	
27	there will be one (1) original and four (4) impression copies, each of which	
28	shall be legible.	
29	(b) At the time of weighing each load of coal, the official weigher	
30	shall deliver to the person in charge of the truck or vehicle containing the	
31	coal so weighed two (2) true copies of the certificate. One (1) of these	
32	copies shall be retained by the person in charge of the truck or vehicle and	
33	kept in his actual possession and upon his person at all times while he is	
34	operating the truck or vehicle. If he shall retire from the truck or vehicle

No person shall operate the truck or 5 vehicle except the one having the certificate in his possession and upon his 6 person. The other copy shall be delivered by the driver of the truck to the 7 person to whom the coal is finally delivered. 8 9 15-59-110. Record of certificate data. 10 (a) The official weigher shall, at the time of weighing each load of 11 coal enter in a well-bound book the matters and things required by this chapter to be given in the certificate of the weigher. 12 13 (b) The forms in the book shall be prescribed in the rules and 14 regulations provided for in § 15-59-103. 15 (c) The things recorded in the book shall agree with the matters and 16 things set forth in the certificate. 17 (d) The official weigher shall retain the book in his possession 18 subject to the inspection of the Department of Arkansas State Police and any 19 citizen of the state, or any interested party, until his term of office shall 20 expire. At that time, he shall deliver the book over to the Department of 21 Arkansas State Police, where it shall be kept as a part of the official 22 records of the Department of Arkansas State Police. 23 24 15-59-111. Weighman and checkweighman - Employer's account book. 25 (a) Before entering upon his duties, the weighman employed at any mine 26 shall take and subscribe an oath, or affirmation, before some proper officer, 27 to do justice between employer and employee, and to weigh the output from the 28 mine honestly and correctly. 29 (b) The miners engaged in working any mine shall have the privilege, 30 if they so desire, of selecting, by a majority vote, and employing at their 31 own expense, a checkweighman, who shall in like manner take an oath, who 32 shall have like rights, powers, and privileges in attending and seeing that 33 coal is correctly weighed and who shall be subject to the same penalties as 34 the regular weighman. Each weighman shall keep account of all coal weighed at 35 the mines in a well-bound book kept for that purpose. The oath or affirmation

shall be kept posted in a conspicuous place in the weight office.

(c) Every owner, agent, or operator of any coal mine in this state shall keep a correct account of the output of coal at his mine in a well—bound book kept for that purpose, therein showing the amount of coal mined in each day, in each month and in each year. The account shall be kept in the general office in this state of the owner, agent, or operator, subject at all times to the inspection of the State Mine Inspector, and, if the mine is leased, subject also to the inspection of the owner of the mine, his agent, or attorney.

## 15-59-112. Scales and measures.

- (a) It shall be the duty of every corporation, company, or person engaged in the business of mining and selling coal by weight to procure and constantly keep on hand at the proper place the necessary scales and whatever else may be necessary to correctly weigh the coal mined by the corporation, company, or person.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the State Mine Inspector to visit each coal mine operated therein. Where the scales are kept, at least once in each year, he shall test the correctness of the scales.
- (c) The owner or operator of each coal mine, or any two (2) or more of the miners working therein, may, in writing, require his attendance at the place where scales are kept at other times in order to test the correctness thereof. It shall be his duty to comply with the request as soon as he can after receiving the request.
- (d) Any corporation or person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall, for each offense, be fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500); and the officers, agents, or employees of the corporation or company whose duty it was to do or perform the act, or to cause it to be done and performed, which is the subject of the indictment, may be indicted jointly with the corporation or company and upon conviction be fined in any sum not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500).

## 15-59-113. Testing weights.

Every agent, owner, lessee, or operator engaged in mining coal in any quantity shall furnish and keep on hand for the use of the State Mine

Inspector, for inspecting, testing, and examining scales, five hundred pounds 1 2 (500 lbs.) of United States standard testing weights. 3 4 15-59-114. Screening coal. 5 (a) It shall be unlawful for any mine owner, lessee, or operator of 6 coal mines in this state, employing miners at bushel or ton rates, or other 7 quantity, to pass the output of coal mined by the miners over any screen or 8 any other device which shall take any part from the value thereof before the 9 coal shall have been weighed and duly credited to the employee sending the coal to the surface. It shall be accounted for at the legal rate of weights 10 11 as fixed by the laws of Arkansas. No employee within the meaning of this 12 section shall be deemed to have waived any right accruing to him under this 13 section by any contract he may make contrary to the provisions thereof. Any 14 provision, contract, or agreement between the mine owners, lessees, or 15 operators thereof and the miners employed therein, whereby the provisions of 16 this section are waived, modified, or annulled, shall be void and of no 17 effect, and the coal sent to the surface shall be accepted or rejected. If accepted, the coal shall be weighed in accordance with the provisions of this 18 19 section, and right of action shall not be invalidated by reason of any 20 contract or agreement. 21 (1) Provided, that in Cane Creek, River, and Logan Townships in 22 Logan County, and all of Johnson County, except Grant Township, all coal mined and paid for by weight may be paid for on the mine run basis or upon 23 24 the screen coal basis, which shall be a matter of agreement between the 25 operators and the miners. 26 (2) Provided, further, that if any coal shall be mined on the 27 screen coal basis, it shall pass over the following kind of screen: 28 (A) The screen shall not be more than four feet (4') wide 29 and not more than twelve feet (12') long, made of steel or iron bars, which 30 shall not be less than five eighths inch (5/8") in thickness on the face and 31 not less than five-sixteenths inch (5/16'') in thickness on the bottom and 32 not less than one and one quarter inch (11/2, ') in width and shall be in no 33 case more than one and one quarter inch (14,',) apart. 34 (B) The screen shall be supported by rests or cross bars. 35 (C) The rests or cross bars shall in no event be placed 36 more than three feet (3') apart.

1 (D) The screen bars shall be placed upon rests in such a 2 manner as to prevent spreading and the rests or cross bars shall be firmly 3 fastened to each side of the chute through which the coal passes. 4 (E) Rests or cross bars shall be so arranged as in no case 5 to rise above the top of the screen bars in such a manner as to retard the 6 speed of the coal in passing over the screen. 7 (F) Where coal is screened before it is weighed it shall 8 be dumped upon flat sheets and passed over the screen as described above and 9 there shall be no obstruction on the screens. 10 (b) Any owner, agent, lessee, or operator of any coal mine in this 11 state where ten (10) or more men are employed underground, who shall 12 knowingly violate any of the provisions of this section, shall be deemed 13 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of 14 not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) nor more than five hundred dollars 15 (\$500) for each offense or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of 16 not less than sixty (60) days nor more than six (6) months, or both such fine 17 and imprisonment. Each day any mine or mines are operated thereafter shall be a separate and distinct offense. Proceedings are to be instituted in any 18 19 court having competent jurisdiction. 20 2.1 15-59-115. Annual report of coal mined. 22 (a) Every owner, agent, lessee, or operator operating a coal mine in 23 this state, shall annually, on July 1 of each year, make a report, under 24 oath, upon blank forms to be furnished by the State Mine Inspector, of the 25 true amount of coal mined each month for the twelve (12) months next 26 preceding the making of the report. The blank forms shall be prepared by the 27 Arkansas State Police and contain the necessary headings and columns to 28 obtain a correct and true statement of all coal of every kind mined. 29 (b) This section shall apply to all mines without regard to the number of men employed. 30 31 (c) Any owner, agent, lessee, or operator who fails or refuses to 32 file, swear to, and return the reports by July 1 of each year shall be deemed 33 guilty of a misdemeanor. On conviction, he shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100) for 34

each day of failure. Any agent, owner, lessee, or operator who knowingly swears to a false report shall be deemed guilty of perjury and punished
