16	(4) Demonstrates educational progress by submitting a norm-
17	referenced standardized test score, taken within nine (9) months of advising

11	(g) The resident school district may adopt a policy to implement the
12	requirements of this section, provided that the policy applies only to
13	participation in interscholastic activities and does not conflict with this
14	section.
