## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 AN ACT TO REAPPROPRIATE THE BALANCES OF CAPITAL  
9 IMPROVEMENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE STATE MILITARY  
10 DEPARTMENT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

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13 AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY DEPARTMENT  
14 REAPPROPRIATION.  
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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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20 SECTION 1. REAPPROPRIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT. There is hereby  
21 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the  
22 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, for the  
23 State Military Department the following:

24 (A) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
25 in Item (A) Section 1 of Act 243 of 2013, for renovations to comply with ADA  
26 requirements, in a sum not to exceed.....\$481,268.

27 (B) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
28 in Item (F) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
29 a Youth Program Facility, in a sum not to exceed.....\$10,000,000.

30 (C) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
31 in Item (C) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
32 armories for the Armory Rehabilitation Project Phase III, in a sum not to  
33 exceed.....\$10,000,000.

34 (D) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
35 in Item (A) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
36 the Camp Robinson Human Resources Office, in a sum not to exceed



1 .....\$456,379.

2 (E) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
3 in Item (D) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation  
4 projects for ADA compliance, in a sum not to exceed.....\$750,000.

5 (F) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
6 in Item (E) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Camp  
7 Robinson Readiness Center, in a sum not to exceed.....\$4,022,000.

8 (G) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
9 in Item (B) Section 1 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Camp  
10 Robinson Sustainment and Restoration project, in a sum not to exceed  
11 .....\$3,000,000.

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13 SECTION 2. REAPPROPRIATION - FEDERAL FUNDS. There is hereby  
14 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the  
15 federal funds as designated by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, for the  
16 State Military Department the following:

17 (A) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
18 in Item (B) Section 2 of Act 243 of 2013, for construction of a Combined  
19 Support Maintenance Shop at Camp Robinson, in a sum not to exceed  
20 .....\$4,761,512.

21 (B) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
22 in Item (C) Section 2 of Act 243 of 2013, for construction of a Camden  
23 Readiness Center, in a sum not to exceed.....\$6,303,889.

24 (C) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
25 in Item (F) Section 2 of Act 243 of 2013, for construction of the Searcy  
26 Field Maintenance Shop, in a sum not to exceed.....\$7,090,304.

27 (D) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
28 in Item (G) Section 2 of Act 243 of 2013, for construction of the Fort  
29 Chaffee Combined Army Collective Training Facility, in a sum not to exceed  
30 .....\$12,695,253.

31 (E) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
32 in Item (A) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
33 the Searcy Field Maintenance Shop, in a sum not to exceed.....\$7,407,510.

34 (F) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
35 in Item (B) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Fort  
36 Chaffee Live Fire/Entry Control Point, in a sum not to exceed

1 .....\$5,187,100.

2 (G) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
3 in Item (C) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
4 the Camp Robinson Human Resources Office, in a sum not to exceed

5 .....\$1,369,136.

6 (H) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
7 in Item (D) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Camp  
8 Robinson Sustainment and Restoration project, in a sum not to exceed

9 .....\$3,000,000.

10 (I) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
11 in Item (E) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation of  
12 armories for the Armory Rehabilitation Project Phase III, in a sum not to  
13 exceed.....\$10,000,000.

14 (J) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
15 in Item (F) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction and renovation  
16 projects for ADA compliance, in a sum not to exceed.....\$750,000.

17 (K) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
18 in Item (G) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Fort  
19 Chaffee Scout/Reconnaissance Infantry Platoon Battle Course Overlay, in a sum  
20 not to exceed.....\$29,847,300.

21 (L) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
22 in Item (H) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of a Vehicle  
23 Washing Facility, in a sum not to exceed.....\$1,365,120.

24 (M) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
25 in Item (I) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Camp  
26 Robinson Readiness Center, in a sum not to exceed.....\$12,066,000.

27 (N) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
28 in Item (J) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Fort  
29 Chaffee Operational Readiness Training Complex (ORTC), in a sum not to exceed  
30 .....\$40,710,880.

31 (O) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
32 in Item (K) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the  
33 Professional Education Center (PEC) Conferencing and Billeting Facility, in a  
34 sum not to exceed .....\$54,000,000.

35 (P) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
36 in Item (L) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Fort

1 Chaffee Sewer System, in a sum not to exceed.....\$3,220,223.

2 (Q) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
3 in Item (M) Section 2 of Act 262 of 2013, for construction of the Regional  
4 Training Institute Phase II, in a sum not to exceed.....\$34,321,930.

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6 SECTION 3. REAPPROPRIATION - CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS. There is hereby  
7 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the Armory  
8 Construction Fund, for the State Military Department the following:

9 (A) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
10 in Item (A) Section 1 of Act 410 of 2013, for repair, construction,  
11 renovation, landscaping and maintenance of armories, hangars, and other  
12 properties held for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, in a  
13 sum not to exceed.....\$2,500,000.

14 (B) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided  
15 in Item (A) Section 3 of Act 243 of 2013, for repair, construction,  
16 renovation, landscaping and maintenance of armories, hangars, and other  
17 properties held for the use and benefit of the Arkansas National Guard, in a  
18 sum not to exceed.....\$95,082.

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20 SECTION 4. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor  
21 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects  
22 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available  
23 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and  
24 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and  
25 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or  
26 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State  
27 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects  
28 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds  
29 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General  
30 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall  
31 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

32 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing  
33 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue  
34 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State  
35 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
36 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any

1 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

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3 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
4 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
5 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
6 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
7 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
8 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
9 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
10 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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12 SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
13 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
14 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
15 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of  
16 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
17 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
18 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm  
19 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
20 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
21 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
22 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
