15 EXPRESSING THE SENATE'S SUPPORT FOR THE
16 BALLOT TITLES AND POPULAR NAMES SELECTED
17 BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE
18 PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS
19 REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE AT THE 2013
20 REGULAR SESSION.

23 WHEREAS, at a January 23, 2014 meeting of the House Committee on State
24 Agencies and Governmental Affairs and Senate Committee on State Agencies and
25 Governmental Affairs, the Secretary of State stated his plan of action for
26 the ballot titles and popular names of the three (3) proposed constitutional
27 amendments referred to the people of Arkansas by the General Assembly at its
28 2013 regular session; and

30 WHEREAS, the Secretary of State plans to use the title of the
31 respective joint resolution as the ballot title and will use a popular name
32 provided by the Attorney General for that purpose; and

34 WHEREAS, the intentions of the Secretary of State are consistent with
35 the intent of the Senate when voting to refer the respective joint
36 resolutions to the people of Arkansas and reflect the law in place when the



1 joint resolutions were adopted by the General Assembly,

3 NOW THEREFORE,

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
5 STATE OF ARKANSAS:

7 THAT the Senate expresses its agreement with the decision of the
8 Secretary of State to use the title of each respective joint resolution as
9 the ballot title and a popular name provided by the Attorney General.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Senate declares that the use of the
12 title of the joint resolution as the ballot title and a popular name proposed
13 by the Attorney General is consistent with the intent of the Senate when
14 voting to refer the proposed amendments to the people of Arkansas for their
15 consideration.
