9	TO ENCOURAGE AND SUPPORT THE MUTUAL RECOGNITION OF
10	DRIVER'S LICENSES BETWEEN TAIWAN AND THE STATE OF
11	ARKANSAS, CLOSER ECONOMIC TIES BETWEEN TAIWAN AND THE
12	UNITED STATES, AND TAIWAN'S MEMBERSHIP IN THE TRANS-
13	PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP.

17	TO ENCOURAGE AND SUPPORT THE MUTUAL
18	RECOGNITION OF DRIVER'S LICENSES BETWEEN
19	TAIWAN AND THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, CLOSER
20	ECONOMIC TIES BETWEEN TAIWAN AND THE
21	UNITED STATES, AND TAIWAN'S MEMBERSHIP IN
22	THE TRANS-PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP.

25	WHEREAS, the Republic of China (Taiwan) is a full-fledged democracy
26	characterized by stability and social order, and Taiwan is the world's
27	eighteenth largest economy, twenty-first largest exporter, twentieth largest
28	importer, and the seventh largest holder of foreign exchange reserves with
29	over \$408 billion; and
30 31	LHEDEAS the United States and Tairran engage in rehust bilateral trade
32	WHEREAS, the United States and Taiwan engage in robust bilateral trade, and the United States ranks as Taiwan's third largest trading partner, and
33	Taiwan is the eleventh largest trading partner of the United States; and
34	rarwan 15 the ereventh rangest trading partner of the united states, and
35	WHEREAS, on average, 580,000 people from Taiwan visit the United States
36	each year and Taiwan's national carriers, China Airlines and EVA Air,

1	currently each have over 20 flights destined for the United States weekly,
2	carrying more than 5,000 passengers daily for business, tourism, study, and
3	observation, and visits to friends and family; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, Arkansas's Department of Finance and Administration and Taiwan
6	desire to streamline the exchange of valid noncommercial driver's licenses
7	for an Arkansas applicant in Taiwan and an applicant from Taiwan living in
8	the State of Arkansas; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, a Memorandum of Understanding between the Department of
11	Finance and Administration and Taiwan has been prepared to acknowledge and
12	permit a mutual recognition of driver's licenses; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, the Memorandum of Understanding between the Republic of China
15	(Taiwan) and the Department of Finance and Administration requires adherence
16	to state and federal privacy laws with regard to any information obtained
17	when exchanging a driver's license, including the Driver's Privacy Protection
18	Act, 18 U.S.C. § 2721 et seq., and personal information protection laws; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, Taiwan is a member of the World Trade Organization and the
21	Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation forum seeking to promote free trade and
22	economic cooperation throughout the Asia-Pacific region; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, a bilateral free trade agreement between Taiwan and the United
25	States and a regional free trade agreement that includes Taiwan would
26	substantially reduce or eliminate most import quotas, duties, and other trade
27	barriers and expand market opportunities for the State of Arkansas and the
28	entire United States; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific Partnership is a proposed trade agreement to
31	enhance trade and investment among member countries and to promote
32	innovation, economic growth and development, and the creation and retention
33	of jobs; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific Partnership represents a high-standard,

ambitious, comprehensive, and forward-looking pathway for achieving an

1	eventual free trade area within the Asia-Pacific region; and
2	
3	WHEREAS, Taiwan's inclusion in the Trans-Pacific Partnership could
4	result in an overall economic gain of nearly \$78 billion in social welfare
5	for the United States and other member countries; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, the United States and the State of Arkansas will benefit from
8	closer economic relationships with Taiwan by negotiating a free trade
9	agreement and a bilateral investment agreement between Taiwan and the United
10	States and by supporting Taiwan's membership in the Trans-Pacific
11	Partnership,
12	
13	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL
14	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
15	
16	THAT the Senate encourages and supports the mutual recognition of
17	driver's licenses between Taiwan and the State of Arkansas, closer economic
18	ties between Taiwan and the United States, and Taiwan's membership in the
19	Trans-Pacific Partnership.
20	
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate
22	copy shall be provided to Mr. Steve C.C. Hsia, Director-General of the Taipei
23	Economic and Cultural Office in Houston by the Secretary of the Senate.
