AN ACT FOR THE NATIONAL PARK COLLEGE
APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2016-2017 FISCAL
YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby
established for the National Park College for the 2016-2017 fiscal year, the
following maximum number of regular employees.

6-5-302. Allocation and transfer of funds.

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SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code Title 6,
Chapter 58 is amended to read as follows:

Chapter 58 – National Park ~~Community~~ College

6-58-101. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(1) "Adult education program" means any classes designed to assist students in preparing for a high school equivalency test, any class designed to improve performance in general basic skills, parenting, English proficiency, or other areas funded by the Adult Education Section of the Department of Career Education; and

(2) "Applied general education courses" means courses from mathematics, communications, social sciences, and similar fields specifically addressing the employment needs of students in one (1) or more occupational programs.

6-58-102. Name change and merger.

(a) Effective July 1, 2003, Garland County Community College is renamed National Park ~~Community~~ College, and the Garland County Community College District is renamed National Park ~~Community~~ College District.

(b) Effective July 1, 2003, Quapaw Technical Institute is merged with and into National Park ~~Community~~ College.

(c) National Park ~~Community~~ College is an institution of higher education and is subject to the laws governing community colleges, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

6-58-103. Board of trustees.

(a)(1) The board member of Quapaw Technical Institute serving on June 30, 2003, and whose term is to expire in 2003, shall become a member of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July 1, 2003, and the term of the board member shall expire on December 31, 2004.

(2) The board members of the Quapaw Technical Institute serving on June 30, 2003, and whose terms are to expire in 2004 and 2005 shall become members of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July 1, 2003, and their terms shall expire on December 31, 2006.

(3) The board members of Quapaw Technical Institute serving on June 30, 2003, and whose terms are to expire in 2006 and 2007 shall become

1 members of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July
2 1, 2003, and their terms shall expire on December 31, 2008.

3 (b)(1) The trustees of the Garland County Community College serving on
4 June 30, 2003, and whose terms expire on December 31, 2004, shall become
5 members of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July
6 1, 2003, and their terms shall expire on December 31, 2004.

7 (2) The trustees of the Garland County Community College serving
8 on June 30, 2003, and whose terms expire on December 31, 2006, shall become
9 members of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July
10 1, 2003, and their terms shall expire on December 31, 2006.

11 (3) The trustees of the Garland County Community College serving
12 on June 30, 2003, and whose terms expire on December 31, 2008, shall become
13 members of the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July
14 1, 2003, and their terms shall expire on December 31, 2008.

15 (c)(1) Three (3) trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College shall be
16 elected at the 2004 general election in the same manner and for the same
17 terms as prescribed in § 6-61-520.

18 (2) Three (3) trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College shall
19 be elected at the 2006 general election in the same manner and for the same
20 terms as prescribed in § 6-61-520.

21 (3) Three (3) trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College shall
22 be elected at the 2008 general election in the same manner and for the same
23 terms as prescribed in § 6-61-520.

24 (d) No vacancy on the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~
25 College shall be filled until the number of remaining board members of
26 National Park ~~Community~~ College with terms expiring on the same date equals
27 two (2) or fewer.

28 29 6-58-104. Effect of merger on employees.

30 (a)(1) All permanent nonprobationary employees of Quapaw Technical
31 Institute or Garland County Community College on June 30, 2003, shall become
32 employees of National Park ~~Community~~ College on July 1, 2003.

33 (2) A person who was a permanent nonprobationary employee of
34 Quapaw Technical Institute or Garland County Community College on June 30,
35 2003, shall be employed by National Park ~~Community~~ College at least until
36 July 1, 2008, if:

1 (A) Job performance is satisfactory;

2 (B) Student enrollment in programs is satisfactory; and

3 (C) Student job placements are satisfactory.

4 (b)(1)(A) By January 31, 2004, employees who were employed on June 30,
5 2003, by Garland County Community College or Quapaw Technical Institute shall
6 have the right to make a one-time choice between:

7 (i) The National Park ~~Community~~ College Health
8 Insurance Plan, which was formerly known as Garland County Community College
9 Health Insurance Plan; or

10 (ii) The health insurance plan adopted by the State
11 and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board for state employees.

12 (B) An employee who was employed by Quapaw Technical
13 Institute on June 30, 2003, shall be entitled to remain in his or her same
14 retirement system under the same conditions then provided by law or as may
15 later be provided by law.

16 (2) The Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College
17 shall promulgate rules and regulations establishing the procedure for
18 employees to exercise benefit options under this subsection.

19 (c)(1) Until the later of July 1, 2008, or the date a reorganization
20 that guarantees the importance and position of technical education is adopted
21 by the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College, the President of
22 the Quapaw Technical Institute as of June 30, 2003, shall be the Vice
23 President for Technical Education at National Park ~~Community~~ College.

24 (2) The employee who was the President of the Quapaw Technical
25 Institute as of June 30, 2003, shall retain and continue to receive:

26 (A) All options, rights, and benefits of employment granted
27 in subsection (b) of this section; and

28 (B) Any transportation benefits that accompanied the
29 position of President of the Quapaw Technical Institute.

30 (d) An employee who was a member of the faculty of Quapaw Technical
31 Institute on June 30, 2003, shall be deemed qualified to teach in the same
32 level programs at National Park ~~Community~~ College if:

33 (1) The faculty member's job performance is satisfactory;

34 (2) Student enrollment is satisfactory; and

35 (3) Student job placements are satisfactory.

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2 6-58-105. Sick leave.

3 The employees of National Park ~~Community~~ College shall be entitled to
4 lump sum payment for unused sick leave under a program similar to that
5 authorized by §§ 21-4-501 and 21-4-502 [repealed].
6

7 6-58-106. Catastrophic leave program.

8 National Park ~~Community~~ College shall establish a catastrophic leave
9 program for all permanent employees. The program shall be similar to that
10 authorized under § 21-4-214.
11

12 6-58-107. Effect of merger on curriculum.

13 (a)(1) National Park ~~Community~~ College shall offer the option of:

14 (A) Applied general education courses in occupational
15 certificate and associate degree programs now offered by Quapaw Technical
16 Institute; and

17 (B) Where appropriate to the program involved, programs now
18 offered by Garland County Community College.

19 (2) Students in the programs involved also may be offered the
20 options of college transfer general education courses in addition to the
21 option of applied general education courses.

22 (b) Without regard to the higher average cost of occupational programs,
23 all current Quapaw Technical Institute programs shall continue to be offered
24 by National Park ~~Community~~ College for as long as they meet industry needs
25 and are fiscally effective.

26 (c) All adult basic education, high school equivalency tests, and high
27 school programs currently provided by Quapaw Technical Institute or the
28 Garland County Community College shall continue at National Park ~~Community~~
29 College.

30 (d) Existing certificate and degree programs now offered at Quapaw
31 Technical Institute or Garland County Community College shall continue to be
32 authorized for National Park ~~Community~~ College until the Arkansas Higher
33 Education Coordinating Board determines that the programs do not meet minimum
34 standards of quality and cost-effectiveness.
35

36 6-58-108. Purchasing.

1 (a) Purchases by National Park ~~Community~~ College shall continue to be
2 made under procedures which were applicable to Garland County Community
3 College or may be made under procedures that were applicable to Quapaw
4 Technical Institute.

5 (b) Flexibility in shop purchases, parts, and house construction
6 programs shall continue in the same manner as authorized for the original
7 institutions.

8
9 6-58-109. Transfer of assets, obligations, records, personnel,
10 property, unexpended balances, and legal authority.

11 (a) On July 1, 2003, all property and other rights, claims, and assets
12 of the Quapaw Technical Institute are transferred to National Park ~~Community~~
13 College.

14 (b) On July 1, 2003, all obligations of the Quapaw Technical Institute
15 become obligations of National Park ~~Community~~ College.

16 (c) On July 1, 2003, all records, personnel, property, unexpended
17 balances of appropriations and funds, and all legal authority will transfer
18 from the Quapaw Technical Institute to National Park ~~Community~~ College.

19 (d) All cash fund balances of Quapaw Technical Institute transferred to
20 National Park ~~Community~~ College shall be used for the operation, support, and
21 improvement of occupational, vocational, technical, and work force
22 development programs of National Park ~~Community~~ College.

23
24 6-58-110. Work Force 2000 funding.

25 Funding from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund which would have been
26 provided to Quapaw Technical Institute shall be provided to National Park
27 ~~Community~~ College to fund work force development, vocational, occupational,
28 and training programs offered by National Park ~~Community~~ College.

29
30 6-58-111. Funding for salary equity.

31 In that funding for and achievement of salary equity among employees of
32 National Park ~~Community~~ College is essential for the successful merger of
33 Quapaw Technical Institute into National Park ~~Community~~ College, this chapter
34 shall become void if, prior to May 1, 2003, the board of either Garland
35 County Community College or Quapaw Technical Institute determines that funds
36 are not available to achieve salary equity.

1
2 6-58-112. Conversion of positions and maximum salaries for Quapaw
3 Technical Institute.

4 The maximum salaries as authorized for the positions in the
5 appropriations act for Quapaw Technical Institute shall be converted to the
6 maximum salaries for the equivalent or similar positions as authorized in the
7 appropriations act for Garland County Community College. The conversion of
8 the maximum salaries shall be approved by the Department of Higher Education
9 for line item salaries or by the Department of Finance and Administration for
10 classified salaries and be reported to the Legislative Council.

11
12 6-58-113. Employee health insurance plan.

13 (a) The Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College may
14 determine each year whether to offer employees of National Park ~~Community~~
15 College more than one (1) health insurance plan from which to choose.

16 (b) If more than one (1) health insurance plan is authorized by the
17 Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College, a permanent employee of
18 the college may annually elect to enroll in:

19 (1) The National Park ~~Community~~ College Health Insurance Plan, if
20 a plan is adopted by the Board of Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~
21 College; or

22 (2) The health insurance plan adopted by the State and Public
23 School Life and Health Insurance Board for state employees, if the Board of
24 Trustees of National Park ~~Community~~ College authorizes college employees to
25 participate in the plan subject to the conditions and rates established by
26 the State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board.

27 (c) The election under subsection (b) of this section must be made:

28 (1) At the time of initial employment by the college; or

29 (2) During the applicable annual open enrollment period for the
30 health insurance plan.

31 (d) An election under subsection (b) of this section is effective for
32 the health insurance plan year and may not be altered until the following
33 annual open enrollment period for the health insurance plan.

34
35 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-61-
36 1201(a), concerning the creation, duties, and funding of the Southwest

Arkansas Higher Education Consortium, is amended to read as follows:

(a) There is created the Southwest Arkansas Higher Education Consortium, composed of Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas, National Park ~~Community~~ College, Henderson State University, Ouachita Technical College, Pulaski Technical College, Rich Mountain Community College, Southern Arkansas University, SAU-Tech, and South Arkansas Community College, to establish and utilize high bandwidth connectivity within the consortium.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-62-314 is amended to read as follows:

6-62-314. Construction project exemption.

The following state-supported institutions of higher education shall be exempt as allowed by § 19-4-1415(b)(5) for construction projects exceeding five million dollars (\$5,000,000) if they have adopted policies and procedures in compliance with state law involving the awarding and oversight of the contracts for design and construction services:

- (1) Henderson State University;
- (2) Southern Arkansas University – Magnolia;
- (3) University of Central Arkansas;
- (4) Mid-South Community College;
- (5) National Park ~~Community~~ College;
- (6) Northwest Arkansas Community College; and
- (7) Rich Mountain Community College.

SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 6-63-305(b)(9), concerning the maximum number of new additional positions, is amended to read as follows:

(9) National Park ~~Community~~ College 40

SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 19-4-906(a)(099), concerning the maximum number of passenger motor vehicles, is amended to read as follows:

(099) National Park ~~Community~~ College 17

SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 19-5-

1 303(ee), concerning institutions of higher education funds, is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 (ee)(1) National Park ~~Community~~ College Fund. There is established on
4 the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State, and the Chief
5 Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the "National Park
6 ~~Community~~ College Fund".

7 (2) The National Park ~~Community~~ College Fund shall be used for the
8 maintenance, operation, and improvement of National Park ~~Community~~ College.

9 (3) The National Park ~~Community~~ College Fund shall consist of:

10 (A) Those general revenues transferred each month from the
11 Garland County Community College Fund;

12 (B) The June 30, 2003, balances in the Garland County Community
13 College Fund; and

14 (C) Any other funds made available for the support of National
15 Park ~~Community~~ College which are required to be deposited into the State
16 Treasury by law.

17
18 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code § 19-11-
19 220(a)(21), concerning agency procurement officials, is amended to read as
20 follows:

21 (21) National Park ~~Community~~ College;

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23 SECTION 13. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
24 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
25 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
26 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
27 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
28 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
29 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
30 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
31 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
32 with in disbursement of said funds.

33
34 SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
35 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
36 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for

1 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
2 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
3 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
4 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
5 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
6

7 SECTION 15. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
8 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
9 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
10 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of
11 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
13 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm
14 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
15 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
16 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
17 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
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
