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
## Subtitle

14 AN ACT FOR THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY  
15 APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2017-2018 FISCAL  
16 YEAR.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the State  
23 Board of Pharmacy for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the following maximum number  
24 of regular employees.

4 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the State Board  
 5 of Pharmacy for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the following maximum number of  
 6 part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from  
 7 funds appropriated herein for such purposes: four (4) temporary or part-time  
 8 employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the  
 9 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act  
 10 for the appropriate classification.  
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12 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated,  
 13 to the State Board of Pharmacy, to be payable from the cash fund deposited in  
 14 the State Treasury as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,  
 15 for personal services and operating expenses of the State Board of Pharmacy  
 16 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, the following:

 33 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - PHARMACY STUDENT LOANS. There is hereby  
 34 appropriated, to the State Board of Pharmacy, to be payable from the cash  
 35 fund deposited in the State Treasury as determined by the Chief Fiscal  
 36 Officer of the State, for transfer by warrant to the cash fund as defined by

1 Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences -  
 2 College of Pharmacy for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018, the following:

 8 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
 10 BY WARRANT. If, during the ~~2016-2017~~ 2017-2018 fiscal year, the need arises  
 11 for additional funding for student loans and additional funds become  
 12 available, the Director of the State Board of Pharmacy may request the Chief  
 13 Fiscal Officer of the State to cause a transfer by warrant up to fifty  
 14 thousand dollars (\$50,000) from the balance of cash funds deposited in the  
 15 State Treasury for the State Board of Pharmacy to the cash fund as defined by  
 16 the Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the University of Arkansas for Medical  
 17 Sciences, there to be used for the sole purpose of providing student loans to  
 18 pharmacy students.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2016~~  
 20 2017 through June 30, ~~2017~~ 2018.

21  
 22 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
 23 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
 24 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
 25 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
 26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
 27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal  
 28 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by  
 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
 30 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

31  
 32 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
 33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
 34 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
 35 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
 36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

1 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
2 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.  
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5 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
6 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
7 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2017 is essential to the operation of  
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2017 could work irreparable harm  
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2017.  
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
