22	"massage therapy" within the Massage Therapy Act, is amended to read as

26	therapeutic purposes of	establishing and maintaining	good physical condition,
27	comfort, and relief of p	ain.	
28	(B) "	Massage therapy" is a healtho	care service that
29	includes gliding, kneadi	ng, percussion, compression,	vibration, friction,
30	nerve strokes, and stret	ching the tissue.	
31	(C) "	Massage therapy" also means t	to engage in the practice
32	of any of the following	procedures:	
33		(i) Massage therapy technique	ies and procedures,

15	(a) Nothing in this This chapter is intended to does not limit,		
16	interfere with, or prevent any other class of licensed health care <u>healthcare</u>		
17	professionals from practicing acupuncture and related techniques when		
18	permitted by its state licensing board.		
19	(b) However, a chiropractic physician shall be entitled to may		
20	practice acupuncture as part of chiropractic practice after completing an		
21	educational program in acupuncture from a college accredited by the Council		
22	on Chiropractic Education.		
23	(c) A massage therapist may practice cupping therapy as part of		
24	massage therapy after completing an educational program in cupping therapy.
