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26	SECTION 1. An	rkansas Code § 11-9-501(b), concerning 1	imitations on
27	compensation for an	employee's disability or death, is amen	ded to add an
28	additional subdivisi	ion to read as follows:	
29	<u>(6) For</u>	r injuries occurring on or after July l,	2017, in cases of
30	total disability ad	judged to be permanent, sixty-six and tw	o-thirds percent
31	(66 2/3%) of the employee's average weekly wage, subject to the maximum		
32	limitations as to weekly benefits as set up in this chapter, shall be paid to		
33	the employee not to	exceed four hundred fifty (450) weeks.	
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35	SECTION 2. An	rkansas Code § 11-9-501(e), concerning c	ompensation
36	payable to dependent	ts of a deceased employee, is amended to	read as follows:

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2 (e) Compensation payable to the dependents of a deceased employee, with the exception of those dependents described in § 11-9-527(d)(2), shall 3 4 be in addition to the funeral allowance and those benefits which that were 5 paid or to which the injured employee was entitled in his or her lifetime under \S 11-9-508 - 11-9-517 and \S 11-9-519 - 11-9-526, and shall not exceed 6 7 four hundred fifty (450) weeks.

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- 9 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 11-9-502(a), concerning exceptions on 10 limitations on compensation for an employee's disability or death, is amended 11 to read as follows:
- 12 The benefits shall be paid for a period not to exceed four hundred 13 fifty (450) weeks of disability, except that this limitation shall not apply 14 in cases of permanent total disability or death.

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- 16 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 11-9-502(b)(3) and (4), concerning the 17 Death and Permanent Total Disability Trust Fund, is amended to read as 18 follows:
- 19 (3) For injuries occurring on or after July 1, 2017, weekly 20 benefits for permanent total disability or death shall not exceed four hundred fifty (450) weeks, except as provided in § 11-9-501(e). 21
- (4) The trust fund shall consist of such funds as may be 23 prescribed by law and shall be administered, invested, and disbursed by the 24 Workers' Compensation Commission.
 - (4)(5) Each employer or the insurance carrier of the employer in each case of death of an employee where there are no dependents shall pay into the trust fund the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500).

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- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 11-9-508(a), concerning the liability of an employer for medical services and supplies under the Workers' Compensation Law, is amended to read as follows:
- 32 (a)(1) The employer shall promptly provide for an injured employee 33 such medical, surgical, hospital, chiropractic, optometric, podiatric, and 34 nursing services and medicine, crutches, ambulatory devices, artificial 35 limbs, eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing aids, and other apparatus as may 36 be reasonably necessary in connection with the injury received by the

2	(2)(A) Rabies is a highly contagious and potentially deadly		
3	infectious disease, and exposure to rabies and the risk of infection under		
4	this section is the direct result of an injury caused by the bite of a		
5	rabies-infected animal or the exposure to saliva of a rabies-infected animal		
6	directly in the employee's eyes, mouth, nose, or open wound.		
7	(B)(i) An employer shall promptly provide reasonably		
8	necessary medical treatment to an injured employee who is exposed to rabies		
9	as described in subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section.		
10	(ii) As used in subdivision (a)(2)(B)(i) of this		
11	section, "reasonably necessary medical treatment" means without limitation		
12	any diagnostic and preventive measures prescribed for detection, diagnosis,		
13	and prevention of rabies.		
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15	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
16	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the provisions of this act		
17	impact the responsibilities of employers and the rights of employees in this		
18	state by amending certain provisions of the Workers' Compensation Law,		
19	including laws impacting compensation to injured employees and the treatment		
20	required by employers to injured employees under the Workers' Compensation		
21	Law; that to ensure fair and reasonable compensation to employees injured at		
22	work and the necessary treatment for injured employees exposed to rabies; and		
23	that this act is immediately necessary to protect the rights of employers and		
24	injured employees in this state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
25	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
26	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
27	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
28	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
29	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
30	bill; or		
31	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
32	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
