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30	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
31	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the populations served by
32	developmental day treatment services programs and child health management
33	services programs are not clearly and distinctly defined; that
34	overutilization of services is occurring due to the lack of clarity; that
35	referring providers need more clarity as to the types of services provided in
36	each program; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure proper

1	screenings, referrals, and treatment for the populations served by these
2	programs and to prevent overutilization or the provision of services in the
3	wrong setting. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act
4	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health
5	and safety shall become effective on:
6	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
7	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
9	<u>bill; or</u>
10	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
11	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
