27	This subchapter shall b	oe known and may be cited	l as the "Enhanced
28	Eligibility and Authentication	on Act".	
29			
30	20-76-802. Enhanced eli	gibility verification.	
31	(a) Before awarding as	ssistance under the Arkan	nsas Medicaid Program or
32	the Supplemental Nutrition As	ssistance Program, former	ely known as food stamps,
33	the Department of Human Servi	ices shall verify the eli	igibility information of
34	an applicant.		
35	(b) The eligibility in	nformation verified under	subsection (a) of this
36	section shall include without	· limitation:	

1	(1) Earned and unearned income;	
2	(2) Employment status and changes in employment;	
3	(3) Immigration status;	
4	(4) Residency status, which shall include a nationwide best	
5	address source to verify that individuals are residents of the state;	
6	(5) Enrollment status in other state-administered public	
7	assistance programs;	
8	(6) Financial resources;	
9	(7) Incarceration status;	
10	(8) Death records;	
11	(9) Enrollment status in public assistance programs outside of	
12	the state; and	
13	(10) Potential identity fraud or identity theft.	
14	(c) The department shall sign a memorandum of understanding with any	
15	department, agency, or division to obtain the information detailed in	
16	subsection (b) of this section.	
17	(d)(1) The department may contract with one (1) or more independent	
18	vendors to provide information detailed in subsection (b) of this section.	
19	(2) A contract entered into under subdivision (c)(1) of this	
20	section shall establish annualized savings that exceed the total annual cost	
21	of the contract to the state.	
22	(e) This section does not prohibit the department from:	
23	(1) Receiving, reviewing, or verifying additional information	
24	related to eligibility not detailed in this section; or	
25	(2) Contracting with one (1) or more independent vendors to	
26	provide additional information not detailed in this section.

28	20-76-803. Real-time eligibility monitoring.	
29	(a) At least quarterly, the Department of Human Services shall receive	
30	and review information concerning individuals who are enrolled in the	
31	Arkansas Medicaid Program or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program,	
32	formerly known as food stamps, that indicates a discrepancy or change in	
33	circumstances that may affect eligibility.	
34	(b) The information provided to the department under this section	
35	shall include without limitation:	
36	(1) Earned and unearned income;	

1	(2) Employment status and changes in employment;		
2	(3) Residency status;		
3	(4) Enrollment status in other state-administered public		
4	assistance programs;		
5	(5) Financial resources;		
6	(6) Incarceration status;		
7	(7) Death records;		
8	(8) Lottery winnings; and		
9	(9) Enrollment status in public assistance programs outside of		
10	the state.		
11	(c) The department shall:		
12	(1) Sign a memorandum of understanding with any department,		
13	agency, or division to obtain the information detailed in subsection (b) of		
14	this section; and		
15	(2) Explore joining any multistate cooperative to identify		
16	individuals who are also enrolled in public assistance programs outside of		
17	the state, including the National Accuracy Clearinghouse.		
18	(d)(1) The department may contract with one (1) or more independent		
19	vendors to provide information detailed in subsection (b) of this section.		
20	(2) A contract entered into under subdivision (c)(1) of this		
21	section shall establish annualized savings that exceed the total annual cost		
22	of the contract to the state.		
23	(e) This section does not prohibit the department from:		
24	(1) Receiving, reviewing, or verifying additional information		
25	related to eligibility not detailed in this section; or		
26	(2) Contracting with one (1) or more independent vendors to		
27	provide additional information not detailed in this section.		
28	(f) If the department receives information concerning an individual		
29	who is enrolled in the Arkansas Medicaid Program or the Supplemental		
30	Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as food stamps, that indicates a		
31	change in circumstances that may affect eligibility, the department shall		
32	review the case using the following procedures:		
33	(1) If the information does not result in the department's		
34	finding a discrepancy or change in the circumstances of the individual that		
35	may affect eligibility, the department shall take no further action; and		
36	(2) If the information does result in the department's finding a		

1	discrepancy or change in the circumstances of the individual that may affect	
2	eligibility, the department shall:	
3	(A) Promptly redetermine eligibility after receiving the	
4	information; and	
5	(B) Provide the individual with:	
6	(i)(a) An opportunity to explain the discrepancy or	
7	change in circumstances in writing.	
8	(b) However, self-declarations by the	
9	individual shall not be accepted as verification.	
10	(c) After the department receives an	
11	explanation, the department may request additional documentation if the	
12	department determines a risk of fraud, misrepresentation, or inadequate	
13	documentation; and	
14	(ii)(a) Written notice that shall describe in	
15	sufficient detail the discrepancy or change in circumstances, the manner in	
16	which the individual may respond, and the consequences of failing to action.	
17	(b) An individual shall have ten (10) business	
18	days or the minimum amount of time required by state or federal law to	
19	resolve the discrepancy or change in circumstances.	
20	(c)(1) If the individual does not respond to	
21	the notice described in subdivision $(f)(2)(B)(ii)(a)$ of this section, the	
22	department shall discontinue assistance for failure to cooperate and provide	
23	notice of intent to discontinue assistance.	
24	(2) Eligibility for assistance shall not	
25	be established or reestablished until the discrepancy or change in	
26	circumstances has been resolved.	
27	(d)(l) If the individual responds to the	
28	notice described in subdivision (f)(2)(B)(ii)(a) of this section and	
29	disagrees with the findings, the department shall reinvestigate the	
30	discrepancy or change in circumstances.	
31	(2) After the reinvestigation, if the	
32	department determines that an error occurred, the department shall take	
33	immediate action to correct the error and take no further action.	
34	(3) After the reinvestigation, if the	
35	department determines that no error occurred, the department shall determine	
36	the effect on the case of the individual and take appropriate action that	

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1	shall include written notice of the action to the individual.	
2	(e) If the individual responds to the notice	
3	described in subdivision (f)(2)(B)(ii)(a) of this section and agrees with the	
4	findings, the department shall determine the effect on the case of the	
5	individual and take appropriate action that shall include written notice of	
6	the action to the individual.	
7	(g) The department shall not discontinue assistance upon a finding of	
8	a discrepancy or change in circumstances until the individual has been given	
9	notice of the discrepancy and the opportunity to respond as required by	
10	subsection (f) of this section.	
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12	20-76-804. Enhanced authentication.	
13	(a) Before awarding assistance under the Arkansas Medicaid Program or	
14	the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as food stamps,	
15	the Department of Human Services shall require applicants to complete an	
16	identity authentication process to confirm that the applicant owns or is the	
17	identity presented in the application.	
18	(b) The identity authentication process shall be:	
19	(1)(A) Conducted through a knowledge-based quiz consisting of	
20	financial or personal questions, or both.	
21	(B) The quiz shall attempt to accommodate unbanked or	
22	underbanked applicants who do not have an established credit history; and	
23	(2) Available to be submitted through multiple channels,	
24	including online, in person, and via telephone.	
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26	20-76-805. Fraud reporting.	
27	The Department of Human Services shall provide information obtained	
28	under this subchapter to the following entities for cases of suspected fraud:	
29	(1) The Office of Medicaid Inspector General; and	
30	(2) The office of the Attorney General.	
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32	20-78-806. Limits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.	
33	(a) The Department of Human Services shall utilize:	
34	(1) Resource limit standards of the Supplemental Nutrition	
35	Assistance Program, formerly known as food stamps, that do not exceed the	
36	standards specified under 7 U.S.C. § 2014(g)(1), as existing on January 1,	

1	201/, unless expressly required by federal law; or
2	(2) Gross income standards of the Supplemental Nutrition
3	Assistance Program, formerly known as food stamps, that do not exceed the
4	standards specified under 7 U.S.C. § 2014(c), as existing on January 1, 2017
5	unless expressly required by federal law.
6	(b) The department shall not grant any noncash, in-kind, or other
7	benefit based on an exemption from either the resource limit standards or the
8	gross income standards unless expressly required by federal law.
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10	20-76-807. Implementation and reporting.
11	(a) The Department of Human Services shall promulgate rules necessary
12	to implement this subchapter.
13	(b) Within six (6) months of the effective date of this subchapter,
14	and annually thereafter, the department shall publish a written report
15	detailing the impact of this subchapter, including without limitation:
16	(1) The number of cases reviewed;
17	(2) The number of cases closed;
18	(3) The number of fraud investigation referrals; and
19	(4) The amount of savings and cost avoidance that have resulted
20	from implementation.
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
