6	(a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(2) of this section, $a$		
7	person is not required to pay and a court shall not issue a warrant or impos		
8	a monetary penalty for failure to pay court-ordered civil penalties, costs,		
9	fees, fines, or restitution for a conviction for a criminal offense while th		
10	person is:		
11	(A) Incarcerated in a:		
12	(i) Local or county jail;		
13	(ii) Facility operated by the Department of		
14	Community Correction;		
15	(iii) Facility operated by the Department of		
16	<pre>Correction;</pre>		
17	(iv) Federal prison; or		
18	(v) Federal immigration detention facility; or		
19	(B) Confined to a hospital or an in-patient facility for a		
20	mental, physical, or emotional condition.		
21	(2) A person is not exempt from paying court-ordered restitution		
22	under this section unless the person has previously been found to be indigen		
23	by the sentencing court.		
24	(b) A person exempt from payment of court-ordered civil penalties,

26	is subsequently released from incarceration or is discharged from the

3	court shall grant the person an additional sixty (60) days to begin payment
4	on the person's remaining court-ordered civil penalties, costs, fees, fines,
5	or restitution.
6	(B) There is no limit to the number of times a person may
7	appear before the court to address the payment of his or her remaining court-
8	ordered civil penalties, costs, fees, fines, or restitution under subsection
9	(b) of this section.
