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2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the law requiring notification		
4	to a licensed driver when a copy of his or her driving record is provided to		
5	another party is costly and cumbersome; that this requirement diverts		
6	resources away from other important state services and unless this		
7	requirement is eliminated some of these important state services will be		
8	reduced or eliminated; and that this act is immediately necessary to avoid		
9	state service reductions or cuts. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
10	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
11	public peace, heath, and safety shall be effective on:		
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved or vetoed by the Governor,		
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
15	bill; or		
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
